Pursuant to Section 1.1206(b) of the FCC's rules, Martha Wright, *et al.* (the "Petitioners") hereby submits the following information in response to the Comments filed by the Arizona Department of Corrections (ADOC) on December 31, 2014 in this proceeding. The ADOC made several statements regarding the state "special services fund" (the "Fund") and how the Fund is used for the benefit of inmates.

In particular, the ADOC stated that the Fund contains "proceeds and commissions from ICS to pay for inmate education and programs." Further, the ADOC asserted that "allocating more funds to inmate education, community college partnerships, work programs, and substance abuse programs better serves the inmates and the community in which they reintegrate upon release." The ADOC asserted that "the cumulative budgetary impact of the proposed rule limiting or prohibiting site commissions on ICS would be significant for ADC, and not readily absorbed by current allocated funds." The ADOC noted that it is "statutorily mandated to use revenue from inmate phone calls for the direct benefit of the inmate population." The ADOC concluded by stating that reduced ICS rates would lead to "reduced educational and job training opportunities...[which would]...have potentially life-altering negative impacts on inmates and their families, not to mention public safety in the community."


In light of these dire warnings that the reduction of ICS rates would cause such an impact in Arizona, the Petitioners obtained the Fund reports that are sent to the Arizona legislature each year. Copies of the 2010 through 2014 annual reports are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

A brief review of the reports reflect that the ADOC's alarmist concerns are entirely misplaced. First, it should be noted that expenditures for "inmate education and programs" actually dropped between the years of 2010 and 2014, from \$3,245,333 in 2010 to just \$1,695,119 in 2014. These expenditures include a statutory withdrawal of at least \$500,000 for a building fund, which further reduces the amount used in 2014 for "inmate education and programs."

While expenditures for "inmate education and programs" were substantially reduced, the amount of revenue earned by the ADOC from its ICS contract steadily increased. In particular, the ADOC received \$3,673,173 in 2010, and received in \$4,124,033 in 2014. In 2013, the ADOC received \$4,401,853 in kickbacks from the state ICS provider.

With the reduction of expenditures for "inmate education and programs," and the increase in ICS kickbacks from the ICS provider, the Fund's balance has ballooned. In 2010, the Fund's end of the year balance was \$1,070,101, meaning that the ADOC received an excess of \$1,070,101 in kickbacks than what it spent on "inmate education and programs." In 2011, the end of the year balance had more than doubled to \$2,878,384, and in 2012, the end of the year balance had increased to \$4,068,893. By the end of 2014, the unused balance in the Fund mandated by state law to be used exclusively for "inmate education and programs" had grown to \$8,879,364. The following chart illustrates these divergent paths:

Thus, it should be clear from this information that the ADOC's warning that a reduction in ICS rates would not be "readily absorbed by current allocated funds" is simply incorrect.

If ADOC never received another dime in kickbacks, it would have sufficient funds to cover its "inmate education and programs" (and building fund) for at least five years before the Fund's reserves were extinguished. As it stands now, the ADOC receives \$3,000,000 more in kickbacks that what is spent on "inmate education and programs" each year, and the ADOC has failed to provide any specific information as to how the reduction in ICS rates would impact the state special services fund.

It should be noted that the Petitioners have not supported the FCC's adoption of rules to eliminate kickbacks. Given the lack of accurate information supplied by correctional facilities, which has prevented the ascertainment of whether the dire and, as illustrated herein, overblown, fears expressed by correctional authorities accurately reflect genuine concerns, the Petitioners have urged the FCC to focus on its clear authority to regulate ICS rates, and permit the ICS providers and correctional authorities to divvy up the ICS revenues as they see fit. The ADOC is certainly permitted to develop policies that are tailored to its communities. However, what the ADOC should not be permitted to do is raise unfounded and untrue concerns that are intended solely to mislead the FCC.

SPECIAL SERVICES FUND

Establishment of Fund and Annual Report

A.R.S. § 41.1604.03 requires that the Arizona Department of Corrections (ADC) establish a special services fund and submit an annual report to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, regarding special services fund transactions relating to the inmate telephone system and the telephonic victim notification system.

Funding Sources

A primary funding source of the special services fund is the inmate telephone system. This system, which is used by inmates for their personal phone calls, is a prepaid or collect-call system. The contracted long-distance telephone service provider allocates a portion of the revenues generated by these calls to the Arizona Department of Corrections. ADC deposits these revenues in the special services fund.

Fund Uses

The special services fund is used to purchase items and services for the benefit, education and welfare of committed offenders.
