CHARACTERISTICS OF NEW COMMITMENTS

1995

This document describes the population of new court commitments to the New York State Department of Correctional Services during calendar year 1995. These tables present information on legal history characteristics of new commitments (e.g. crime, minimum sentence, prior criminal record) and demographic characteristics (e.g. age, sex, ethnic status, county of commitment). In addition, several tables show trends in new court commitments across the years 1989 through 1995.

DIVISION OF PROGRAM PLANNING, RESEARCH AND EVALUATION

SUMMARY

1. Total number of admissions

There were 34,721 total admissions to the New York State Department of Correctional Services in calendar year 1995. Of these 22,980 (66%) were new court commitments, 7,819 (23%) were returned parole violators and 3,922 (11%) were other admissions (see Table 1.1, p. 4 and Figure 1, p. 3).

2. Commitment Offense

Over 30% (7,064) of 1995 new commitments were violent felony offenders, 45% (10,408) drug offenders, 14% (3,271) property or other offenders, 7% (1,610) coercive crime offenders and 3% Youthful and Juvenile Offenders (651) (see Table 2.1, p. 8 and Figure 2, p. 7).

Both violent felony offense commitments and drug offense commitments dropped from 1992 to 1995. Property Offense Commitments and Youthful Offender commitments in 1995 were slightly higher proportionally in 1995 than in 1992 though only Youthful Offender commitments rose numerically. (see Table 2.2, p. 10).

3. Second felony offenders

Forty-three percent of 1995 new court commitments were sentenced as first felony offenders (N=9,931), 54% (N=12,479) as second felony offenders and 2% (N=557) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1, p. 13; Figure 3, p. 12).

4. Felony Class

Three quarters of new felony commitments in 1995 were for Class C or lower category felonies (see Table 4.1, p. 21). Most lower felony commitments were also second felony commitments. This is partly because persons sentenced for murder and other A-I felonies are always sentenced as first felony offenders (see Table 4.2, p. 25).

5. Average minimum sentence

The average minimum sentence for 1995 new court commitments was 41.2 months (the median was 24.0 months). For persons sentenced as a first felony offender the average was 43.2 months (median 18.0 months), for persons sentenced as a second felony offender the average was 37.4 months (median 30.0 months), the average for a persistent felony offender was 91.5 months (median 48.0 months) (see Table 5.2, p. 33). The average minimum sentence for a second felony offender (37.4 months) is lower than that for a first felony offender (43.2 months) because of a greater concentration of lower level Class D and E offenders in the second felony group and the absence of all A-I and most A-II felony commitments from the second felony offender group.

The average minimum term for legislatively designated violent felony offenders committed in 1995 was 70.2 months (median 36.0 months) while for other coercive crime offenders it was 25.3 months (median 24.0 months). For drug offenders the average was 31.8 months (median 28.0). For property and other offenders the average was 21.0 months (median 18.0 months) and for Youthful and Juvenile Offenders it was 20.7 months (median 12 months) (see Table 5.2, p. 33).

6. Prior adult criminal record

Examination of the prior adult criminal record of 1995 new court commitments, shows 13% had no prior adult arrest, 7% had a prior adult arrest but no conviction, 20% had a prior conviction but received a sentence other than jail or prison, 30% had served a prior local jail sentence, and 30% had previously served a state or federal term (see Table 6.1, p. 44 and Figure 6, p. 43).

7. Drug Commitments

Though the number of drug offender court commitments fell from 1992 (N=11,225) through 1995 (N=10,408), they represented 45% of the admissions in each year. (see Table 2.2, p. 10).

8. Gender

Males were 92% of 1995 new court commitments (N=21,145), females 8% (N=1,835) (see Table 2.1, p. 8 and Figure 8, p. 61).

The number of female offenders committed to state prison has grown substantially in recent years from 283 (3.5%) in 1976, to 721 (4.8%) in 1986, to 1,835 (8.0%) in 1995 (see Table 8.2, p. 62).

9. Race/Ethnic status

Whites made up 15% of 1995 new court commitments, African Americans 48%, Hispanics 36% and all others 1% (see Table 9.4, p. 68 and Figure 9, p. 64).

10. Age

The average age of 1995 new court commitments was 30.2 years. For males the average age was 30.0 years, for females 32.9 years (see Table 10.1, p. 81).

11. Region of the State

In 1995, 67% (N=15,521) of court commitments were from New York City, 11% (N=2,442) were from suburban New York City counties, 12% (N=2,709) were from upstate counties with a population center of 50,000 or more, and 10% (N=2,305) were from the remaining upstate counties (see Table 11.1, p. 92 and Figure 11, p. 91).

12. Country of Birth

Among 1995 new court commitments 76% (N=17,500) were born in the United States, 10% (N=2,311) in United States Possessions, 8% (N=1,862) in the island nations located in the Caribbean Sea, 2% (N=467) from nations in South America, and 3% (N=726) in other nations (see Table 12.1, p. 106 and Figure 12, p. 104). As a percentage of total new court commitments foreign born inmates have remained fairly constant (12.7% in 1992, 12.6% in 1993, and 13.2% in 1994and 1995) (see Table 12.1, p. 106).

13. Education

The average educational level (based on last grade completed as reported by the inmate) among 1995 new court commitments is 10th-11th grade. Based on tests administered at reception to the Department, the average reading level is below 8th grade, the average mathematics level is below 7th grade (see Tables 13.1, 13.2, 13.3, pp. 114-116).

14. Marital Status

Sixty-eight percent of 1995 new court commitments were single never legally married, 16% were married, 7% reported common-law relationships, and 10% were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1, p. 121).

15. Jail Time

Average jail time served by new commitments in 1995 (5.9 months) rose for the first time in three years the third year in a row. It had been 5.9 months in 1994, and 5.8 months in 1993, 6.1 months in 1992 (see Table 15.1, p. 123).

CHARACTERISTICS OF NEW COURT COMMITMENTS 1995

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a series designed to make data available on the inmate population of the New York State Department of Correctional Services. The report presents basic descriptive information on selected characteristics of offenders admitted to Department custody as court commitments. Information on criminal justice system variables is presented (e.g., commitment offense type, prior adult criminal record) as well as information on demographic variables (e.g., ethnic status). In addition, at several stages in the report, commitments in 1995 are compared with commitments received in each of the three preceding years to determine whether any significant shifts have occurred over the period 1992 through 1995.

The overall finding of this latest report in an annual series is "modest change in many significant areas." Total admissions for 1995 were 34,721, a small increase from 34,577 in 1994 when the first decline occurred in total admissions since 1984. New court commitments declined from 23,149 in 1994 to 22,980 in 1995, the third year in a row this has occurred. However, there was an increase in returned parole violators from 6,570 in 1994 to 7,819 in 1995. Other admissions declined in 1995 from 4,854 in 1994 to 3,922.

New court commitments are the main focus of this annual report. In this category, it was found that most component populations fell. Male new commitments fell from 21,357 in 1994 to 20,667 in 1995. However, female new commitments rose from 1,796 in 1994 to 1,835 in 1995. African American, Hispanic and White new commitments decreased in 1995 from 1994 levels as did Asian and other ethnic groups.

Among crime categories, new commitments for violent felony offenses were down sharply at 7,064 in 1995 from 7,715 in 1994. New commitments for drug offenses were also down, from 10,504 to 10,408.

"Other Coercive" commitments (e.g. Manslaughter 2, various sex offenses other than Rape 1 or Sodomy 1) jumped from 1,288 in 1994 to 1,610 in 1995, a four year high. Property and other offenders also rose from 3,168 in 1994 to 3,359 in 1995 and youthful offenders increased from 463 to 539, also a four year high.

Section 1

TYPE OF ADMISSION


Individuals may be committed to state prison following conviction of a felony offense in a New York State court. For some offenses the court is required by law to sentence an individual to a state correctional facility. For other felony offenses a period of incarceration in state prison is one of several sentencing alternatives available to the judge. The large majority (66%) of people admitted in 1995 to the New York State Department of Correctional Services were committed from county courts following conviction for a felony offense. Twenty-three percent of admissions to state prison were returned parole violators. The remaining 11% were admitted for other reasons. Figure 1 shows the proportion of admissions that fall into each of three general categories: (1) new court commitments, (2) returned parole violators, and (3) all other admissions. Detailed data for each of these general categories is examined in the analysis which follows.

New Court Commitments

Table 1.1 presents the number of 1995 admissions to state prison that fall into each specific admission categories. These specific admission categories are grouped into three larger categories. The first of these larger categories is referred to as new court commitments and it comprises 66% (N=22,980) of total admissions. New court commitments are persons who have been convicted of a felony offense and are sentenced to state prison as a result of this conviction.

There are several subcategories in the new court commitment pool. The first group, labeled "new court commitments", are persons committed to state prison for conviction of a felony offense. They comprise 22,483 (65%) of the 1995 new admissions, see Table 1.1. Included in the new court commitments group are people who were on parole at the time they committed the offense for which they were admitted to prison in 1995. Persons identified as "new term absconders from temporary release" in Table 1.1 (N=289) are people who had been incarcerated on a previous conviction and had been approved for temporary release. These inmates absconded from the temporary release program and were returned to DOCS custody in 1995 after they committed a new crime. They were returned to state prison on the new conviction charge. There were also 207 individuals who were arrested while in the community on temporary release and these persons were returned to prison following conviction on the new charges. One person was admitted to DOCS in 1995 on a new charge after escaping from the Department's custody.

¹This category includes all Juvenile Offenders, the majority of whom were transferred from the NYS Division for Youth to DOCS to complete the sentence for their original crime.

Returned Parole Violators

The second large category of admissions to state prison consists of returned parole violators. Until October 1, 1995, all felony offenders committed to prison in New York State received an indeterminate sentence which had a minimum term and a maximum term. For those inmates once they have served their minimum sentence they may, at the discretion of the Board of Parole, be released to parole supervision. Furthermore, once inmates with indeterminate sentences have reached their conditional release date (defined as service of two-thirds of the maximum sentence) they must, by law, be released to parole supervision if they accept parole supervision. The grant of parole may be revoked if the parolees violate the rules that are a condition of release on parole. People whose parole status have been revoked are returned to state prison to continue service of the original sentence until such time as they are re-released by the Board of Parole, reach their conditional release dates, or reach the maximum expiration date of their sentences. People returned for violation of parole were 23% (N=7,819) of 1995 admissions. This is a significant increase from 1994 when 6,570 persons were returned for violating parole.

Other Admissions

The third large category of admissions to state prison (labeled "other admissions", see Table 1.1) contains a range of different reasons for re-admission to state prison. "Returns from court ordered discharge" refers to individuals who had appealed the original conviction and whom while court proceedings were taking place the court had ordered to be discharged. People whose criminal charges (and sentence) were upheld by the appellate courts and who were returned to state prison fall into this category (N=134). "Returned escapees" (N=6) are inmates who had escaped from Department custody and were then returned. Similarly, the category "returned absconders from temporary release" (N=2,797) accounts for inmates who had been placed in the Department's temporary release program and who absconded from this program and were then returned to custody. The number of returns in this category were significantly lower than the 3,551 recorded in 1994 as a result of Governor Pataki's Executive Order restricting the eligible crimes for inmates to participate in the Department's Work Release Program.

Inmates transferred to Central New York Psychiatric Center for mental health services are passed to the legal custody of the Office of Mental Health. These individuals continue to earn time toward the service of their sentence. Inmates who are returned to the Department of Correctional Services from the Office of Mental Health are identified as "Returns from Office of Mental Health" (N=569). Return from other agency" (N=5) refers to persons who were transferred from the Department to another state, to the federal system, or to other criminal justice agencies and who were subsequently returned to the Department. "Return temporary release arrest" (N=370) refers to inmates who were arrested while out on work release and then returned to Department custody. These inmates did not receive a new sentence prior to their return to DOCS' custody. There were an additional 38 admissions to the Department in 1995 categorized as "other."

COMMITMENT OFFENSE


The commitment crime for the persons who were new court commitments to the Department of Correctional Services in 1995 is presented in Table 2.1 (see also Figure 2 p. 7). Commitment crimes are grouped into several larger categories, the first of which is termed "violent felony". During a 1978 special session the New York State Legislature enacted laws designed to provide for more severe penalties for certain violent felony crimes (see N.Y.S. Penal Law Section 70.02). The Legislature designated certain crimes as "violent felony offenses" (e.g., Attempted Murder 2nd, Manslaughter 1st, Rape 1st, Robbery 1st, Assault 1st). The Legislature did not include Murder 1st, Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the designated violent felony legislation because these crimes as class A-1 felony offenses already carry the most severe sentences ranging from 15 years to Life imprisonment. However, due to their violent nature and commensurate sentencing structure, we include Murder 1, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the violent felony group.

Persons convicted of violent felony crimes were 31% (N=7,064 cases) of 1995 new court commitments.

The second general category is labeled "other coercive" crimes. It includes crimes that are of a violent or coercive nature but were not designated by the legislature as violent felony crimes. These "other coercive" crimes accounted for 7% (N=1,610) of new court commitments. The third category includes all felony classes of drug commitments. Forty-five percent (N=10,408) of 1995 new court commitments were for drug offenses. The fourth general category is termed "property and other" and contains non-violent offenses such as Burglary 3rd, Grand Larceny, Forgery, and Stolen Property. Property and other felonies comprised 14% of 1995 new court commitments (N=3,271).

The last general category is made up of Youthful Offenders and Juvenile Offenders who were 3% (N=651) of new court commitments. Youthful Offenders (N=540) are persons aged 16 to 19 at the date of the offense who were convicted of a felony crime, but were subsequently granted Youthful Offender status by the court. (See New York State Criminal Procedure Law Section 720.10). Juvenile Offenders (N=111) are persons who committed especially serious violent felony offenses before their sixteenth birthday and were tried as adult offenders. (See NYS CPL 70.05. Also see Appendix C for offenses that pertain to Juvenile Offenders and the sentences that apply to them).

Gender Differences in Commitment Crime

The population of persons committed to state prison in 1995 was predominately male. Females were only 8.0% (N=1,835) of the 22,980 persons committed to state prison in 1995.

Among men committed to state prison in 1995, 32% were convicted of a violent felony crime. This is more than twice the percent of women (14%) committed to state prison for these offenses (see Table 2.1).

Women committed to state prison were, however, considerably more likely to have been convicted of a drug offense than were men. Of females committed to state prison, 67% were convicted of a drug offense compared with 43% of males.

Shifts in Commitment Crime 1992-1995

The proportion of violent felony offenses amongst all new court commitments declined for the second year in a row in 1995, dropping almost three percent, while the "other coercive offenses" rose from 5.6% to 7.0%. Drug offenders as a proportion of the total remained about the same (45.3% versus 45.4% a year earlier). Property and other offenses rose to 14.2% from 13.7% a year earlier. Youthful offenders, including juvenile offenders, rose numerically and as a proportion of the total to 2.8%.

Section 3

SECOND FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

The New York State Penal Law provides for more severe sentences for second felony offenders and for persistent felony offenders (see Appendix A). In addition, the penal law requires with some exceptions a mandatory state prison term for persons convicted of a second felony offense (see section 70.06 NYS Penal Law).


Among 1995 new court commitments 43% (N=9,931) were sentenced as first felony offenders, 54% as second felony offenders (N=12,479) and 2% (N=557) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1 and Figure 3.1).

Those persons in Table 3.1 identified as second felony offenders are defendants who were sentenced by the trial court judge as a second felony offender. Some of those persons listed as first felony commitments have been convicted of prior felony crimes and some have previous sentences to state prison, but they were not sentenced as second felony offenders. This occurs because the statutes for class A-1 felony crimes do not contain provisions for sentencing as a second felony offender. The penalty for A-1 felony crimes is already the most severe so there is no need for additional enhancement in length of sentence.

There are differences in the percent of persons sentenced as second felony offenders in each general crime group. According to Table 3.1, in 1995 61% of those committed for property offenses and 63% of persons committed for drug offenses were sentenced as second felony offenders. Among those committed for violent felony crimes, only 41% were sentenced as second felony offenders.

Table 3.2 also shows crime by second felony offender status yet the percentages are based on felony offender status rather than commitment crime.

Increase In Second Felony Offenders Committed For Drug Offenses

Data is presented in Table 3.3, according to commitment crime, on the number of persons committed to DOCS as a first, second, or persistent felony offender for the period 1992 through 1995. The proportion of commitments sentenced as a second felony offender decreased slightly from 57% in 1992 (N=14,324), to 54% (N=12,479) in 1995.

The proportion of violent offenders sentenced as second felony offenders also dropped slightly from 1992 (43%) to 1995 (41%). There was also a small decrease among the drug offenders sentenced as second felons in that period from 66% in 1992 to 63% in 1995 (see Tables 3.3 and 3.4).

There were also either small or no differences in the proportion sentenced as a second felony offender in other crime groups in the time period. In 1992 59% of commitments for other coercive offenses were second felony offenders; it eased to 58% in 1995. Among property offenders there was a slight decline in second felony offenders from 69% in 1992 to 61% in 1995. (See Table 3.4 for the percent of first, second and persistent felony offenders within each specific crime group.)

Section 4


FELONY CLASS CATEGORY

In New York State felony offenses are classified into one of several felony class categories: Class A (including Class A-I and A-II), Class B, Class C, Class D, Class E, and Youthful Offender. In general, more serious offenses are categorized as Class A, Class B, or Class C felonies and the less serious offenses are categorized as Class D or Class E felonies. Youthful Offenders do not have a felony class. There are still less serious offenses that are treated as misdemeanors or violations, but only those convicted of a felony may be sentenced to state prison. Conviction for an "attempt" of a particular felony offense generally drops the conviction into the next lower felony class category. For instance, Robbery 1st is a Class B felony offense, but Attempted Robbery 1st is a Class C felony offense as is Robbery 2nd. The felony class category of the conviction offense is relevant because the sentencing laws are based on the felony class category. That is, the range of minimum and maximum sentences that apply to conviction for a particular offense are governed, in part, by the felony class of the offense. Appendix A contains a brief summary of the range of minimum and maximum sentences for each felony class category.

Table 4.1 shows the specific commitment crime, broken out by felony class category, for new court commitments committed to DOCS in 1995 (see also Figure 4). (Appendix B contains the Penal Law Section number for the offenses listed in Table 4.1.) (The letters "ATT" before the offense indicate that the crime was an attempt.) Two percent of 1995 new court commitments were Class A-I crimes (N=562). Class A-II offenses were also 2% (N=553) of commitments. Offenses in the Class B felony category were 20% (N=4,645) of 1995 new court commitments. Class C felony offenders were 25% (N=5,756) of 1995 commitments. The Class D felony category was the largest at 32% (N=7,390) of new commitments. Class E felony offenders comprise 15% (N=3,522) of new commitments. Youthful Offenders constituted 2% (N=539) of new commitments. (See Table 4.2).

¹For example, the minimum sentence range for a Class D felony offense for a first felony offender is 1 year to 2 years and 4 months. The sentencing court judge must select a minimum term that falls between 1 year and 2 years 4 months. Other factors affect the range of sentences that apply to each felony class category. In general, if the offense is a legislatively designated violent felony the sentence length range is more severe. For a Class B violent felony the lowest legally permissible minimum term is 2 years. For all other Class B felony offenders the lowest legally permissible minimum term is one year. It is also the case that the range of sentences that may be available to the judge after a conviction depends on whether the person is a first, second or persistent felony offender. In general, persons who are convicted of a second felony offense face more severe penalties than do first felony offenders.

Table 4.1 indicates that the first felony offender group had a higher concentration of persons sentenced for Class B (30%) felony offenses when compared with second felony offenders 13%. The second felony group had a higher concentration of Class D (42%) and Class E (20%) felony offenses than did the fist felony group (20% and 9%, respectively). Both the B and C first felons and the D and E second felons include large numbers of drug offenders. However, the B and C first felons also include many violent felony offenders. This reflects an important part of sentencing. For many first felons, their offenses are violent felony offenses. That results in a state prison sentence since the 1978 Violent Felony Offender Legislation requires a prison sentence for convictions of a Class B or C violent felony. For many of those sentenced as a second felony offender it is the existence of a prior felony conviction that results in a state prison commitment. In 1973 the legislature passed laws that required persons convicted as a second felony offender must be sentenced to state prison.

The percent of first, second and persistent felony offenders in each felony class group is presented in Table 4.2. As one moves from the Class A-II category to the Class E category the proportion of second felony offenders steadily increases. About 72% of Class E and 70% of Class D commitments were second felony offenders.

Crime by Felony Class and Predicate Felony Status

In recent years several proposals have been presented to the legislature which would permit judges to select a sentencing alternative other than state prison for second felony offenders convicted of Class D or Class E non-violent offenses. Consideration of these and other proposals has often led to requests for additional information, particularly on the number of court commitments in a calendar year that fall into subgroups defined by: (1) crime, (2) felony crime class and (3) first, second or persistent felony offender status. These data are presented for 1995 in Table 4.3.

Trends in Commitments by Felony Class

Table 4.4 shows changes across the years 1992-1995 in first, second, and persistent offenders and in the crime classes of each offender group. Generally, there were negligible reductions except for Class E second felons, which dropped by 5% in the 1992-1995 period or almost imperceptible increases. The exception to this were second felony, class C commitments which rose from 11% of all commitments in 1992 to 14% in 1995, and second felony, class E commitments which dropped from 16% of all commitments in 1992 to 11% in 1995.


MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM SENTENCE

Persons committed to prison in New York State receive an indeterminate sentence which is composed of a minimum period of imprisonment and a maximum period of imprisonment. The minimum sentence reflects the shortest period of time that a person must serve in prison before being considered for release on parole.³ The maximum sentence reflects the longest possible period that the defendant can be held in custody on the instant offense. Individuals serving an indeterminate sentence are eligible for release to parole after having served the minimum sentence (given favorable action by the Board of Parole) and they must by law be released once the conditional release date is reached (the conditional release date is the point at which 2/3 of the maximum sentence has been served). Persons in custody may serve past the conditional release date if for disciplinary reasons they have lost "good time" during service of the sentence.⁴

A crosstabulation of crime by minimum sentence length for 1995 commitments is presented in Table 5.1. The table shows the number and percent of cases in each minimum sentence length category for several different types of crime. (Also see Figure 5).

³Felony criminal offenses in New York are classified according to six felony class categories (Class A,B,C,D, and E felony offenses, and Youthful Offenders). For each felony class category the legislature has enacted certain provisions which affect the length of the minimum term of imprisonment and which determine the range of maximum sentence available to the judge (see Article 70 New York State Penal Law). In addition to the felony class category that the offense falls into, the minimum period of imprisonment may differ depending on whether the defendant is a first, second, or persistent felony offender, and/or whether the defendant has been convicted of a legislatively designated violent felony offense. In general, the minimum-maximum sentence range is more severe for those defendants with a prior felony conviction and for those convicted of violent felony crimes. For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for a violent felony crime the judge must in most cases set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-third the maximum sentence. For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for other felony offenses (i.e. all offenses not designated as a violent felony) the judge must fix the minimum period of imprisonment at some point between one-year and one-third the maximum term. For second felony offenders committed to state prison the judge must set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-half the maximum sentence. Article 70 of the Penal Law spells out the different sentencing provisions that pertain to armed felony offenders; first, second or persistent felony offenders; and violent felony offenders. Appendix A presents a brief summary of the sentences that apply to each felony class category.

Good time refers to days deducted from the maximum sentence for inmates who maintain a satisfactory disciplinary record while under custody.

Average and Median Minimum Sentence by Crime

The average and median minimum sentence length according to commitment crime and first or second felony offender status are presented in Table 5.2. In this and other tables the arithmetic average and the median are used as measures of central tendency. The median minimum sentence was 24 months in 1995. The median represents the value of the middle case (i.e. the case or cases at the 50th percentile) in the distribution of cases and is preferred by some users because it is less sensitive to extreme values than is the arithmetic average.

The average minimum sentence for the total new court commitment population in 1995 was 41.2 months. It is a weighted average of the average for all offenses; for example, the average minimum sentence for violent felony crimes was 70.1 months, for other coercive crimes it was 25.3 months, for drug offenders 31.8 months for property offenders 21.9 and for Youthful Offenders 13.8 months.

The average minimum sentence was generally longer for persons sentenced as a second or persistent felony offender when compared with those sentenced as a first felony offender. For example, the average minimum sentence for first felons sentenced for Robbery 1st was 37.8 months, for second felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st it was 82.0 months, and for persistent felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st the average was 224.7 months. The reader should note, however, the average minimum sentence for second felony violent offenders is less than that of first felony violent offenders (56.7 versus 74.7 months). The reader is reminded that a person cannot be sentenced as a second felon for murder in the second degree. Persons sentenced for Murder 2, therefore, inflate the length of the average minimum sentence for first felony offenders.

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence Length

The average minimum sentence by crime and second felony offender status for each year 1992 through 1995 is presented in Table 5.3. (This table combines persistent and second felony offenders.) The Table shows that the overall average minimum sentence for both first felons and second felons rose from 1992 to 1995. In 1992, the average minimum sentence for first felons was 37.2 months while in 1995 it was 43.2 months. Among second felony offenders, the average minimum rose from 35.7 in 1992 to 37.4 in 1995. In the four year period, average minimum sentences for second felony offenders increased every year by a year or more.

The data in Table 5.3 are repeated in Table 5.4 except that the measure of central tendency is the median.

Minimum Sentence by Felony Class Category

Average minimum sentence by felony class category and second felony offender status for 1995 New Court Commitments is presented in Table 5.5. These figures show that as the felony class declines from A-I to E the average minimum sentence also declines. Generally, within each felony class category, as one moves from first felony offender to second felony offender to persistent felony offender the average minimum sentence increases, as would be expected based on the sentencing requirements found in the New York State Penal Law (see Appendix A for a brief statement of the sentence range for each subgroup).

Table 5.6 shows average minimum sentence by felony class category and second felony status (persistent felons have been grouped with second felony offenders) for each year 1992 through 1995. Within each specific felony class category as one moves from 1992 to 1995 the average minimum sentence fluctuates within a narrow range from one year to the next.

Among A-I first felony offenders, median and average minimum sentences rose in the time period from 280.2 months on average, and a median of 276 months in 1992 to 326.0 months on average and a median of 300 months in 1995. A-II also rose from 51.9 months on average to 53.8 months and from a median of 36 months to 48 months. Otherwise there was basically no change over time within the first felony group nor among second felony offenders.

In Table 5.7 the data are broken out by felony class category, violent or nonviolent offense; and first or second felony offender status. Some increases in the median minimum sentences occurred from 1992 to 1995. Non-violent first felony median sentences were 12 months in 1992 and 16 months in 1995. Median sentences of violent second felony offenders were 36 months in 1992 and rose to 48 months in 1995.

Average sentence lengths which are sensitive to extreme values, did not move in synchrony with medians. For example, from 1992 to 1995 average minimum sentence lengths for non-violent, first felony commitments fell from 23.9 to 22.9 months. However, the median, after remaining constant for the first two years, rose to 16 months in 1994 and remained there in 1995. Average minimum sentences received by violent first felony offenders increased from 53.5 in 1992 to 73.7 months in 1995. Among violent second felons, average minimum sentences increased from the 1992 average of 53.8 months to 64.5 months in 1995.

Maximum Sentence Length

A crosstabulation of commitment crime by maximum sentence is presented in Table 5.8. Since the development of programs such as Earned Eligibility, 5 the minimum sentence is a much better estimate of the length of time that will be served in state prison than is the maximum sentence.

Persons committed for violent felony offenses were more likely (42.8%) to be given a maximum sentence of nine years (108 months) or longer when compared with drug (17.2%) or property (18.3%) offenders. Ten percent of violent felony offenders received a Life maximum sentence (see Table 5.8). Six percent of drug offenders received a Life maximum sentence.

Table 5.9 shows average and median maximum sentence length by crime and second felony offender status. A Life sentence has been treated as 25 years. For 1995 new court commitments the average maximum sentence was 87.7 months, the median 60 months. The average maximum sentence for a first felony offender was 97.0 months (median 54.0 months). The average for second felony offenders was 76.0 months. This is somewhat lower than the average for first felony offenders because the second felony group had a higher concentration of the lower level Class D and E felony commitments than in the First Offender group (see Table 5.7).

Section 6

PRIOR ADULT CRIMINAL RECORD

Prior adult criminal record for 1995 new court commitments is presented in Table 6.1. Persons are coded according to their most serious penetration into the criminal justice system. Among 1995 commitments 30% had served a prior prison term, and an additional 30% had served a prior term in a local jail. Another 20% had a prior conviction which resulted in a sentence to probation or a fine or other non-incarcerative sentencing alternative. Seven percent had prior misdemeanor or felony arrests which did not result in a conviction and 13% had no prior arrests (see also Figure 6).


Trends in Prior Adult Criminal Record

Prior criminal history for new court commitments received across the years 1992 to 1995 is shown in Table 6.2. There was a no change in 1995 in the percent committed to state prison who had no prior arrest (13%) when compared with 1994.

There was some increase in the persons committed who had a prior prison term between 1992 and 1995, up from 27% to 30% of all commitments. The other three groupings each showed minor declines over the four year period.

⁶The first category shows those who have no prior felony or misdemeanor arrests. The second category contains those persons who have prior arrests but no prior convictions (i.e. charges were dismissed or defendant was acquitted or rap sheet has no further information on disposition of the charges). The third category contains those who have prior convictions but did not receive a sentence to jail (i.e., they were sentenced to probation, fined, adjourned in contemplation of dismissal, ordered to pay restitution, or other sentencing alternative). The fourth category includes those who have prior convictions and who received a sentence that included a term in a local jail (including those who may have received a sentence of jail and then probation). The last category includes those persons who have served a prior state or federal prison term.

Section 7

DRUG COMMITMENTS

Given the dramatic effect on the number of commitments to state prison as a result of drug enforcement efforts, this section contains several tables which focus only on drug offenders committed to state prison.⁷


The number of drug offenders committed to state prison decreased between 1992 (N=11,225) and 1995 (N=10,408) (see Table 7.1). The decline occurred across most of the felony class categories. The number of Class A-I drug offenders committed to state prison dropped from 84 individuals in 1992 to 56 cases in 1995. The A-II drug offenders declined from 675 to 553 in the same four years. The number of Class B drug felony offenders, however, rose between 1992 (N=2,252) and 1995 (N=2,454); as did the percent of all drug commitments that were in Class B from 20% to 24%. Increases both numerically and as a percent of all drug commitments also occurred in the Class C category from 2,729 in 1992 (24%) to 3,369 in 1995 (32%). Class D drug offenders fell from 3,830 in 1992 to 3,244 in 1995 and Class E drug offenders fell from 1,655 in 1992 to 732 in 1995.

Among drug commitments there has been a tiny decrease in the percent that were sentenced as second felony offenders. In 1992 approximately 66% (N=7,446) were sentenced as second felons but by 1995, 65% (N=6,768) of drug offenders were sentenced as second felons (see Table 7.2).

In 1995, 90% of the Class D and 93% of E drug commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders, compared with 66% of Class C drug commitments and 36% of Class B drug commitments (see Table 7.3).

Trends in Drug Commitments by Possession or Sale

Of those committed to state prison for a drug offense the large majority are commitments for drug sale which outnumber those drug possession by a better than 3 to 1 margin, see Table 7.4 and Figure 7). As a percent of total drug commitments to state prison, those convicted of sale have risen over the four-year period 1992 to 1995, from 69% of total drug commitments in 1992 (N=7,625) to 77% of drug commitments in 1995 (N=8,049).

Trends in Drug Commitments by Region

Drug commitments to state prison rose only in upstate counties while dropping in the downstate area (see Table 7.5, counties that fall into each specific region are listed in Table 11.1 below). Further, every region of the state shows a higher concentration of second felons among drug offenders committed over the period 1992 through 1995. For example, in Suburban New York 69% of drug offenders committed in 1995 were sentenced as second felony offenders compared with 61% in 1992.

Table 7.6 shows felony crime class and second felony offender status for drug commitments over the period 1992 to 1995. In this table the five New York City counties are shown separately.

Trends in Drug Commitments by Gender

A small drop in the four year period in the percent of drug offenders who are second felony offenders is evident among both male drug commitments (i.e., 67% second felons in 1992 dropping to 66% in 1995) and female drug commitments (61% sentenced as second felons in 1992 and 59% in 1995) (see Table 7.7).

Drug Commitments by Ethnic Status

There are important differences in commitments to prison for drug offenses according to ethnic status. Among whites committed to prison in 1995, 16% were convicted of a drug offense, among African Americans 44% were committed for a drug offense, and among Hispanics 60% were committed for a drug offense (see Table 9.3).

The majority of whites committed for drug offenses were first felony commitments (55%) in 1995. This is different from the pattern for African American and Hispanic offenders where the majority of drug offenders were second felony offenders.

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence for Drug Offenders

In any year, as the felony class category of drug commitments declined from most serious (e.g., Class A-I, Class A-II) to least serious (Class E) the average minimum sentence also declined (see Table 7.9). Further, second felony offenders were earning longer sentences than were first felony offenders in the study period (see Table 7.10). For example, in 1994 a first felony offender convicted of a Class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 20 months, but a second felony offender convicted of a Class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 62.6 months. Medians provide a similar picture. In 1994, a Class B felon convicted as a first felony offender received a median minimum sentence of 12.0 months while a Class B second felony offender received a median minimum of 54.0 months. These medians had not changed in the entire period.

Within each specific felony class category of first offenders the average minimum sentence rose across the period 1992 to 1995 (see Table 7.10).

The average minimum sentence for the total group of drug offenders committed in 1995 was 31.8 months. For first felony offenders it was 25.8 months and for second felony offenders 35.0 months, a difference of over nine months. That the difference in average minimum sentences between the two groups is not even greater is due to the larger number of Class C, D and Class E offenders in the second felony group with somewhat lower minimum sentences compared to Class A-I and A-II offenders in the first felony group.


There were significant differences in the commitment offense of males and females in the study period. In 1995, 32% of males were committed for a violent felony offense compared with only 14% of females (see Table 8.1). Males were also slightly more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (7% compared with 5% for females) and a bit more likely to be committed for property and other offenses (15% compared with 13%). On the other hand, females were considerably more likely than males to be committed to state prison for a drug offense (67% compared with 43% for men).

The proportion of commitments to state prison who were drug offenders declined slightly among females but rose slightly among males in this period. In 1992 the percent of males committed for a drug offense was 42%; in 1995 it rose to 43%. However, among females the percent of drug offenders decreased from 72% in 1992 to 67% in 1995.

Long Term Trend in Female Commitments

The largest number of female offenders committed to state prison were committed in calendar year 1991 (N=2,264). Since 1991, however, female new felony commitments have declined from the year earlier period. In 1995 there were 1,835 female new commitments. Table 8.2 provides a historical view of the gender distribution of new commitments. From 1976 to 1985 females were 4% of the annual pool of court commitments. Then following a transition period from 1986 to 1988, the proportion of females in the annual pool jumped in 1989 to a new plateau of around 7.5%. The proportion of females spiked to a high of 9.1% in 1991. The level recorded in 1995 was the second highest proportion of female commitments in DOCS' recent history.

Race/Ethnic Status of 1994 Commitments


In 1995, 15% of commitments were white, 48% were African American, and 36% were Hispanic. The balance were: 0.2% Native American (N=37), 0.4% Asian (N=88), and 0.5% other ethnic groups (N=108) (see Table 9.1).

Commitment offense by ethnic status for 1995 new court commitments is shown in Tables 9.2 and 9.3. (In Table 9.3 Native American, Asian and other ethnic groups are categorized as "other"). Identical proportions of whites and African Americans were committed for violent felony crimes (34%), (see Table 9.3). Compared with whites and African Americans, fewer Hispanics (25%) were committed for violent offenses. Whites were also more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (11%) than either African Americans (7%) or Hispanics (5%). Among Hispanics, the largest commitment crime category was drug offenses (60%). Drug offenders also made up a large percent of African Americans sentenced to state prison (44%). Whites were more likely to be committed for property offenses (37%) than either African Americans (12%) or Hispanics (8%).

In brief, in 1995 white offenders were nearly as likely to be committed to state prison for violent felony offenses (34%) as for, property offenses (37%). African American offenders were primarily committed for drug offenses (44%), and secondarily for violent felony offenses (34%). Hispanic offenders committed to state prison in 1994 were primarily drug offenders (60%), and a quarter were also violent offenders (25%) (see Table 9.3, p. 67).

Table 9.4 shows the ethnic status distribution for specific offenses with the percentages based on each offense group. For example, among commitments for murder in 1995 (N=361), 16% were whites (N=71), 53% were African Americans (N=235) and 29% were Hispanics (N=130). The remaining two percent (N=7) were others.

Race/Ethnic Status of Female 1995 Commitments

Earlier tables have shown the high concentration of drug offenses among female commitments and the concentration of drug offenses among Hispanic commitments. The data in Table 9.5 show that 82% of Hispanic females and 65% of African American females committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. In sharp contrast, only 40% of white females committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. Compared with African American and Hispanic females, white females were more likely to be committed for a violent felony offense (18% compared with 16% for African Americans and 9% for Hispanics) and considerably more likely to be committed for a property offense (31% compared with 14% for African Americans and 5% for Hispanics (see Table 9.5, p. 69).

Trends in Commitment Crime by Ethnic Status

The number of white, African American and Hispanic offenders in each crime category for commitment years 1992 through 1995 is shown in Table 9.6. These are the figures upon which the percentages in Table 9.7 are based.

The proportion of African Americans committed for violent felony offenses declined slightly from 37% in 1992 to 34% in 1995 (see Table 9.7). In other areas there were also minor changes in African American offense patterns in the period 1992-1995, e.g. from 6% of African Americans committed for other coercive offenses in 1992 to 7% of African Americans committed for other coercive offender in 1995.

Among whites there was likewise only a small decline in the percent committed for violent felony crimes between 1992 (36%) and 1995 (34%); and only a slight increase in the percent committed for property offenses (34% in 1992 to 37% in 1995) (see Table 9.7). There was a small decline in the percent of whites committed for drug offenses between 1992 (17%) and 1995 (16%).

Among Hispanics the proportion committed for violent crimes declined from 29% in 1992 to 28% in 1995. There was an increase in drug offense commitments from 58% in 1992 to 59% in 1995 in this component population.

The raw number of males in each crime and ethnic status group for the years 1992 to 1995 is presented in Table 9.8. The percent figures in Table 9.9 are based on the numbers in Table 9.8. Since males are such a predominant portion of total commitments the patterns in the ethnic status distribution of offenses over time generally correspond to those found in Table 9.7 (which are briefly discussed in the paragraphs immediately above).

Trends in Commitment Crime by Race/Ethnic Status for Females

The number of white females committed to state prison rose 38% in the period 1992 (N=203) to 1995 (N=281), (see Table 9.10). The number of African American females committed to state prison dropped from 1,011 in 1992 to 892 in 1995. This is a 12% decrease since 1992. The number of Hispanic females committed to state prison in 1995 was almost identical (N=657) to the number committed in 1992 (N=658).

The crime distribution of white, African American and Hispanic females changed little over the years 1992 to 1995 (see Table 9.11). For white females the percent committed for violent felony crimes fluctuated somewhat between 1992 and 1995, with a low of 18% in 1995 and a high of 23% in 1992. The percent of white females committed for drug offenses fell 3% from 46% in 1992 to 40% in 1995. Sixteen percent of African American females were committed for a violent felony in 1995, exactly the same as in 1992. In 1992 68% of African American females were sentenced to prison for a drug felony and it was 71% in 1995, a three percent rise. In 1992 there was a high concentration of drug offenses among Hispanic females (84%). The percent committed for drug offenses dropped slightly to stand at 82% in 1995. The percent of Hispanic females committed for a violent felony dropped a little from 10% in 1992 to 9% in 1995. Among other female offenders, Native American, Oriental, etc., there was a large decline in the percent committed for violent crimes in the study period from 50% to 40%. There was also a decrease in the percent for white females committed for violent offenses (see Table 9.11, p. 77). This decline was also found in the percent committed for drug offenses, except among other females where from 1992 to 1995 there was a slight increase (from 17% of other females to 20% of other females in 1995).

AGE AT ADMISSION

The average age at admission was 30.2 years in 1995. For males the average was 30.0 years, for females 32.9 years (see Table 10.1).

Whites were the oldest at commitment (average age 31.8 years), followed by Hispanics (average age 30.4 years), African Americans (29.6 years) and other (28.5 years). The modal age at commitment for all whites was 30-34 years old but there were almost as many 25-29 year olds. For African Americans, Hispanics and for "others" it was 25-29 years old (see Table 10.2).

The age distribution by gender and ethnic status for 1995 new court commitments is presented in Table 10.3 (see also Figure 10).

Crime by age at commitment (broken into 12 categories) is presented in Table 10.4. The table shows that drug and property crime commitments were somewhat older on average than violent felony commitments. For example, only a little over a third (35%) of violent felony 1995 new commitments were at least 30 years of age whereas more than half (56.3%) of property offenders and drug offenders (54.3%) were at least 30 years old at commitment.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Gender

Among 1995 commitments females were older on average than were males committed for the same offenses; for example, among drug offenders, females were almost two years older on average than males; among violent felony offenders, females were more than two years older on average than males; and among property offenders, females were over three years older on average than males (see Table 10.5).


It can also be seen in Table 10.5 that for both males and females the average age at commitment within the violent felony group was rising across the years 1992 through 1995 (although it dropped slightly for females from 1993 to 1994 before resuming its rise in 1995). However, among drug and coercive offenders, the average age of new commitments rose from 1992 to 1995. Among males committed for drug offenses, for example, the average age at commitment rose from 30.4 in 1992 to 31.4 years in 1995. The average age of female drug commitments also rose, from 31.1 years in 1992 to 33.3 years in 1995. The average age of male property and other felony commitments increased by a year from 1992 to 1995, rising from 30.6 years to 31.8 years. It also rose among females from 33.5 years to 34.9 years.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Race/Ethnic Status

Whites committed in 1995 for violent felony crimes were older (average age 30.8) than either African Americans or Hispanics committed for violent crimes (average age 27.5 years and 27.4 years) (see Table 10.6). Whites were also older than the others among other coercive offenders and drug offenders. Hispanics were on average younger than others among all offenders, except for drug offenders where their average age was higher than for African Americans.

Trends in Age at Commitment

Offenders committed in 1995 were slightly older (average age 30.2) than those committed in 1992 (average age 29.2) (see Table 10.7). Between 1992 and 1995 the percent of commitments that were 19 to 24 years of age declined from 28.6% to 24.5%, while commitments that were between 30 and 44 years of age increased from 35.6% to 40.7%.

COUNTY AND REGION OF COMMITMENT

Sixty-eight percent (N=15,521) of 1995 new court commitments were sentenced to state prison from New York City (see Table 11.1 and Figure 11)⁹. Eleven percent (N=2,442) were sentenced from the Suburban counties near New York City. Twelve percent (N=2,709) were committed from Upstate Urban counties and 10% (N=2,305) from Upstate Rural counties. Table 11.1 also shows that a higher proportion of females were from New York City (72%) than were males (67%).

Commitment Crime by County and Region

There were important differences in commitment crime according to region of the state. Commitments from New York City were most likely to be drug offenders (51%) followed by violent felony offenders (30%) and then property offenders (11%) (See Table 11.2). The suburban New York counties were similar to New York City with drug commitments as the largest category (40%), followed by violent felony offenders (35%) and then property offenders (18%). Compared with either New York City or Suburban New York City, persons committed from Upstate counties were less likely to be committed for drug offenses and more likely to be committed for property offenses. For example, among commitments from Upstate Rural counties 28% were property offenders, 32% were drug offenders and 26% were violent felony offenders.

Table 11.3 presents the commitment crime distribution for each New York State county.

Felony Class of Crime by Region


The percent of cases in each felony class category was similar across regions of the state (see Table 11.4) with a few exceptions. For example, among commitments from Upstate Rural counties New York there was a lower percent of Class C felony offenders (14%) and a somewhat higher percent of Class E felony offenders (25%) when compared with other regions. (e.g. New York City 27% "C" felonies and 14% felonies).

The 62 counties in New York State are grouped for statistical purposes into 4 larger regions. New York City refers to commitments from the five counties (or boroughs) that comprise New York City which are Kings, New York, Queens, Richmond, and Bronx counties. Suburban New York City refers to Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester counties. The Upstate Urban region refers to counties in upstate New York that have a population center of 50,000 or more. Finally, Upstate Rural refers to all the remaining New York State counties.

There was little variation between the regions were almost identical on serious felony commitments (Class A-I, A-II, and B). The combined proportion of Class A-I, Class A-II, and Class B offenders committed from each region in 1995 was as follows: New York City 26%, Suburban New York 24%, Upstate Urban 24%, and Upstate Rural 22%. (Table 11.4)

Trends in Commitments by Region

Overall, the percent of offenders committed from each region of the state showed little change from 1992-1995 (see Table 11.5); upstate urban commitments were 12% of the total in 1995 same as in 1994 and New York City commitments were 68% of the total in 1995 down 3% from 1992 (71%). Suburban New York commitments declined 1% from 1992 (11%) to 1995 (10%).

COUNTRY OF BIRTH

Country of birth for new court commitments across the years 1992 through 1995 is presented in Table 12.1. Among 1995 new court commitments, 76.2% (N=17,500) were born in one of the 50 states of the United States. Another 10% (N=2,311) were born in one of the U.S. Possessions (for purposes of immigration persons born in United States Possessions are treated as U.S. citizens). Another 8% (N=1,862) were born in one of the island nations in the Caribbean Sea. One percent were born in countries in Central America (N=231) and 2% (N=467) in South America. Another 3% (N=389) were born in other countries in the world. For 111 cases (0.5%) place of birth was missing.

Trends in Foreign Born Commitments

The number of new commitments who were foreign born decreased slightly across the four years 1992-1995. There were 3,169 foreign born persons committed in 1992, 3,158 in 1993 and 3,059 in 1994, and 3,055 in 1995. (See Table 12.1) As a percent of total new court commitments foreign born inmates have remained fairly stable varying from 11.4% to 13.3% over the period 1992 to 1995.

Although from 1992 to 1995, new commitments fell 9%, the number of commitments who claim to have been born in a few countries increased. These include: China (36 in 1992, 51 in 1995) and Mexico 48 in 1992, 87 in 1995. Twent-three new commitments in 1995 were born in Brunei, a remote island sultanate near Indonesia, up from none in 1992.


Commitment Crime for Foreign Born

Table 12.2 presents crime by region of birth (i.e. countries are grouped into regions, see Table 12.1) for 1995 new court commitments. Among the thirty percent of 1995 new court commitments who were sentenced for violent felony crimes were a high percent of offenders from North America (i.e. Canada and Mexico) (48%), Near East (41%), Central America (43%), and Asia (61%).

A high percent of the offenders born in U.S. Possessions (70%), island nations in the Caribbean (56%), and South America (48%) were included in the 45% of 1995 new commitments sentenced for drug offenses. Among the 3,055 foreign born persons committed in 1995, 49% (N=1,500) were convicted of a drug offense (see Table 12.2, p. 107).

Of the 10,408 drug offenders committed in 1995 70% (N=7,247) were born in the United States, 15% (N=1,607) in U.S. Possessions, and 15% (N=1,528) in foreign nations (see Table 12.3).

EDUCATION

Education level by gender for 1995 new court commitments is presented in Table 13.1. In this table education status refers to the last school grade completed as reported by the inmate. Where the individual claims to have earned a General Education Diploma (i.e. High School Equivalency) he or she was assigned to the 12th grade. As shown in Table 13.1, the median grade level achieved was 11th grade based on reports of new commitments at reception. (On average, inmates reported 10.5 years of schooling.)

In order to properly place inmates in education programs, the Department administers a battery of tests during the reception/classification process. These include tests on reading vocabulary and reading comprehension given in English or Spanish or both. In those cases where inmates were tested in English and Spanish, the results are combined with the inmate scores reflecting the score received on the Spanish language test. Table 13.2 shows the distribution of combined reading vocabulary and reading comprehension scores for 1995 commitments. The average reading level (7.9) based on these tests was 8th grade. While the average grade completed as reported at reception was more than 10th grade, tested reading proficiency was 2-1/2 to 3 grade levels below this depending on gender. While only 1% of inmates claimed education year completed of 4th grade or below (see Table 13.1), almost a quarter of them (24%) performed on reading tests at the less than 5th grade level (see Table 13.2).

Results from tests on ability to perform math computations and to solve math problems are shown in Table 13.3. For 1995 new commitments the average proficiency in mathematics based on these test scores was less than 7th grade.

Trends in Education Level

Reading proficiency based on tests administered at reception was at the 7th to 8th grade level in each commitment year 1992 through 1995 (see Table 13.4). Average proficiency level in math was at the 6th grade level in the period (see Table 13.5). There was only a tiny change from 1992 to 1995 (see Table 13.5) but it was a positive change with mathematics scores climbing one-tenth of a grade. Reading scores did not rise or fall from 1992 through 1995. For reading, the average scores were 7.9; for math, the average scores were from 6.6 to 6.7.



MARITAL STATUS

Among 1995 commitments 68% were single, never married, 16% of commitments reported that they were legally married; 9% reported common law relationships and 10% reported that they were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1). Males and females were about equally likely to report being, divorced or separated. Males were slightly more likely to report common-law relationships (7%) than females (3%) and more females (3%). Negligible differences between females and males we found in other areas such as percent widowed.

Over the 4 year review period neither of the genders showed a significant change in the proportion of legally married amongst the new commitments. Females went from 16.8% in 1992 to 16.2% in 1995. Males started at 15.7% in 1992 and ended at 15.4%.

JAIL TIME

Among those individuals committed to state prison many have accumulated time in a local jail prior to the date of reception at a New York State correctional facility. Following arrest the court may require that a defendant post bail to ensure that the defendant will re-appear at a later date for further court proceedings. Those unable to post bail when it is required by the court will generally be confined in a local jail pending court proceedings. Also, for those sentenced to a state prison term, jail time may accumulate between the date of sentencing and the date of transfer to a state correctional facility. Time spent in a local jail prior to commitment to state prison is credited toward service of the minimum term.

On average, the length of time new commitment served in a local jail was higher in 1995 (5.9 months) than in 1994 (average 5.8 months) or in 1993 (5.8 months). Not since 1992 (average 6.1 months) has the average time served in a local jail been as high or higher than in 1995.

Jail Time by Crime and Crime Class

Violent felony offenders have served more jail time than have other offenders. In 1995, new commitments, convicted of a violent felony had served 7.6 months on average compared to 5.4 months for other coercive offenders, 4.5 months for drug offenders and 4.6 months for property offenders (see Table 15.1). Also, when sentenced for the same crime, persons sentenced as a second felony offender usually have served more jail time than those sentenced as first felony offenders. This is seen in comparisons of average jail time for first and second felony offenders. For instance, second felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st in 1995 served 9.6 months of jail time on average compared with 6.5 months for first felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st. That the average jail time for the total group of first and second felony offenders is similar (5.9 and 6.0 months on average in 1995) may be due to a high concentration of drug and property offenders in the second felony group. (See Section 4, p. 19-28.)

Average and median jail time according to felony class category for the year 1992 through 1995 is reflected in Table 15.2. These data show that as the felony class category declines from most serious (Class A-I felony) to least serious (Class E felony) the average jail time also declines. This is true for both first and second felons. Median for class C first felony offenders are lower than for class D first felons for unknown reasons

Table 15.3 further classifies these data by violent felony offender status. Most average and median jail times were higher for second felony offenders committed for the same class of felony, as expected.

Jail Time by Region

In 1992 the average jail time for commitments from New York City was 6.1 months and it was 6.0. (see Table 15.4) Months in 1995, a barely noticeable decrease. For Suburban New York counties the average jail time (7.3 months) in 1995 about half a month higher than it was in 1992 (6.8 months). Upstate Urban counties average jail time remained constant at 5.4 months from 1992 to 1995. Average jail time in Upstate rural counties have also stayed fairly constant at between 5.0 and 5.2 months in the period 1992 to 1995.

Since the sentence is determinate (i.e. fixed at a specified number), the law eliminates eligibility for release on parole supervision. This differs from an indeterminate sentence where there is a specified minimum and maximum sentence and the inmate is eligible for release on parole supervision after serving the minimum term. Further,, with a determinate sentence the inmate is entitled to earn good time credit up to 1/7 of the determinate term, under the old law (correction Law Section 803), the inmate was entitled to earn good time credits up to 1/3 of the maximum sentence.
