

CHARACTERISTICS OF NEW COURT COMMITMENTS

2003

This document describes the population of new court commitments to the New York State Department of Correctional Services during calendar year 2003. These tables present information on legal history characteristics of new commitments (e.g. crime, minimum sentence, prior criminal record) and demographic characteristics (e.g. age, sex, ethnic status, county of commitment). In addition, several tables show trends in new court commitments across the years 2000 through 2003.

DIVISION OF PROGRAM PLANNING, RESEARCH AND EVALUATION

SUMMARY

1. Total Number of Admissions

There were 26,955 total admissions to the New York State Department of Correctional Services in calendar year 2003. Of these 17,343 (64%) were new court commitments, 8,637 (32%) were returned parole violators and 975 (4%) were other admissions (see Table 1.1, p. 3 and Figure 1, p. 2).

2. Commitment Offense

Approximately 30% (5,125) of 2003 new court commitments were violent felony offenders, 38% (6,541) drug offenders, 20% (3,405) property or other offenders, 10% (1,670) other coercive crime offenders and 3% (602) Youthful and Juvenile Offenders (see Table 2.1, p. 7 and Figure 2, p. 6).

The proportion of violent felony offense commitments of the total commitments increased over the four-year period, from 27% in 2000 to 30% in 2003, while the proportion of drug offense commitments decreased from 44% to 38% (see Table 2.2, p. 9).

From January 1, 2000 to December 31, 2003, the proportion of violent felons under DOCS' custody rose from 53.3% to 55.8% (see p. 8).

3. Second Felony Offenders

Forty-seven percent (N=8,173) of 2003 new court commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders, 52% (N=9,002) as first felony offenders and 1% (N=168) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1, p. 12; Figure 3, p. 11).

4. Felony Class

Half (53%) of the new felony commitments in 2003 were either Class D or E felony commitments (see Figure 4, p. 19). Fifty-six percent of Class D and 65% of Class E commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders (see Table 4.2, p. 25).

5. Minimum and Maximum Sentence

The average minimum sentence for 2003 new court commitments was 45 months. For persons sentenced as a first felony offender the average was 46 months and for persons sentenced as a second felony offender the average was 41 months. The average minimum sentence of the first offender group is longer due to the inclusion of all Class A-1 commitments in this category (see Table 5.2, p. 35).

The average minimum term for legislatively designated violent felony offenders committed in 2003 was 83 months (see Table 5.3, p. 36). The minimum has remained fairly constant for most offenders since 2000.

The average maximum term for legislatively designated violent felony offenders decreased each year over the period of study from 101 months in 2000 to 95 months in 2003 (see Table 5.10, p. 47).

The average maximum term increased for drug offenders since 2000 from 85 months to 93 months.

6. Prior Adult Criminal Record

Of 2003 new court commitments, 13% had no prior adult arrest, 7% had a prior adult arrest but no conviction, 21% had a prior conviction but received a sentence other than jail or prison, 28% had served a prior local jail sentence, and 30% had previously served a state or federal prison term (see Table 6.1, p. 50 and Figure 6, p. 49).

7. Drug Commitments

Among the 6,541 drug commitments received in 2003, 60% were the result of a drug sale conviction. The proportion of drug offenders received from drug sales has decreased significantly over the four year study period. In 2000, 72% of the drug commitments were for sales rather than possession. (see Table 7.4, p. 57).

8. Gender

Men were 93% of 2003 new court commitments (N=16,181) (see Table 2.1, p. 7 and Figure 8, p. 66).

The 1,162 women committed in 2003 were the fewest since 1989. However, the 1,162 female commitments in 2003 were still almost triple the 405 received in 1981 (see Table 8.2, p. 68).

9. Race/Ethnic Status

Whites were 20% of 2003 new court commitments, African Americans 47%, Hispanics 30% and all others 3% (see Table 9.1, p. 71 and Figure 9, p. 70).

10. Age

The average age of 2003 new court commitments was 31.6 years. For males the average age was 31.4 years, for females 34.6 years (see Table 10.1, p. 85).

11. Region of the State

In 2003, 54% (N=9,374) of court commitments were from New York City, 11% (N=1,985) were from suburban New York City counties, 18% (N=3,171) from upstate urban counties with a population center of 50,000 or more, and 16% (N=2,813) were from the remaining upstate counties (see Table 11.1, p. 98 and Figure 11, p. 97).

In contrast, 2000 commitments from New York City constituted 59% of all the commitments, 11% were from suburban New York City counties, 15% were from upstate urban counties and the remaining counties contributed 16% (see Table 11.5, p. 106).

12. Country of Birth

Of the 17,322 new commitments for whom there is information on country of birth, 87% were born in the United States or one of its possessions, 7% were born in the nations bordering the Caribbean, and 5% were born in another country (see Table 12.2, p. 110).

13. Education

The average educational level (based on last grade completed <u>as reported by the inmate</u>) among 2003 new court commitments was the 11th grade (see Table 13.1, p. 113). Based on tests administered at reception to the Department, the average reading level was between 6th and 7th grade, and the average mathematics level was 6th grade (see Tables 13.2, 13.3, pp. 113-114).

14. Marital Status

Seventy percent of 2003 new court commitments were single, never legally married; 15% were married; 4% reported common-law relationships; and 10% were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1, p. 117).

15. Jail Time

Average jail time served by new commitments was 6.7 months in 2003. This figure remained fairly constant throughout the study period of 2000-2003 (see Table 15.1, p. 119).

16. Life Without Parole

Fifteen new commitments were received in 2003 with sentences of Life Without Parole. All were committed for Murder 1st. The Life Without Parole commitments ranged in age from 22 years to 46 years. Six were committed from New York City, two were committed from Suburban New York, and the other seven were committed from Upstate New York (see Table 16.1, p. 124).

Section 1

TYPE OF ADMISSION

Individuals may be committed to state prison following conviction for a felony offense in a New York State court. For some felony offenses, the court is required by law to sentence an individual to a state correctional facility. For other felony offenses, a period of incarceration in state prison is one of several sentencing alternatives available to the judge.


The large majority (64%) of people admitted in 2003 to the New York State Department of Correctional Services were new court commitments. These are people who were committed from county courts following conviction for a felony offense. Thirty-two percent of admissions to state prison were individuals who had been released to parole supervision and then returned to state prison for violation of parole rules. The remaining four percent were readmissions to state prison for other reasons. Figure 1 shows the proportion of admissions that fall into each of three general categories: (1) new court commitments, (2) returned parole violators, and (3) all other admissions. Detailed data for each of these general categories is examined in the analysis which follows.

New Court Commitments

Table 1.1 presents the number of 2003 admissions (N=26,955) to state prison that fall into each specific admission category. These specific admission categories are grouped into three larger categories. The first of these larger categories is referred to as new court commitments and it comprises 64% (N=17,343) of total admissions. New court commitments are persons who have been convicted of a felony offense and are sentenced to state prison as a result of this conviction.

There are three subcategories in the new court commitment pool. The first group, labeled "new commitments", are persons committed to state prison for conviction of a felony offense. They comprise 17,317, or almost the entire portion of this category (see Table 1.1). Included in the new commitments group are people who were on parole at the time they committed the offense for which they were admitted to prison in 2003. Persons identified as "new term absconders from temporary release" in Table 1.1 (N=16) are people who had been incarcerated on a previous conviction and had been approved for temporary release. These inmates absconded from the temporary release program and were returned to DOCS custody in 2003 on a new conviction charge after they committed a new crime. There were also 10 individuals who were arrested while in the community on temporary release and these persons were also returned to prison following conviction on the new charges.

Returned Parole Violators

The second largest category of admissions to state prison consists of returned parole violators. Until October 1, 1995, all felony offenders committed to prison in New York State received an indeterminate sentence which had a minimum term and a maximum term. Those inmates who received an indeterminate sentence, once they had served their minimum sentence could, at the discretion of the Board of Parole, be released to parole supervision. Furthermore, once inmates with indeterminate sentences have reached their conditional release date (defined as service of two-thirds of the maximum sentence) they must, by law, be released to parole supervision (if they accept parole supervision) unless the Time Allowance Committee takes away good time. Beginning October 1, 1995, inmates could be given a determinate sentence. Inmates with a determinate sentence must serve 6/7ths of the sentence before reaching the conditional release date. The grant of parole may be revoked if the parolee violates the rules that are a condition of release on parole. People whose parole status has been revoked are returned to state prison to continue service of the original sentence until such time as they are rereleased by the Board of Parole, reach their conditional release dates, or reach the maximum expiration date of their sentences. People returned for violation of parole were 32% (N=8,637) of 2003 admissions.

The "Returned from Parole" category of Admissions includes 557 post-release supervision violators. For violent felonies committed on or after September 1, 1998, for which a determinate sentence of imprisonment is ordered, a period of "post-release supervision" is included under Penal Law 70.45. A post-release supervision violator is an individual who has violated conditions of post-release supervision established by the Board of Parole.

Other Admissions

The remaining category of admissions to state prison is labeled "other admissions" (see Table 1.1). This category contains a range of different reasons for re-admission to state prison. "Returns from court ordered discharge" refers to individuals who had appealed the original conviction, been discharged per court order and had then been returned to custody when the sentence and criminal charges were upheld by the appellate courts (N=59). "Returned escapees" (N=6) are inmates who had escaped from Department custody and were then returned. Similarly, the category "returned absconders from temporary release" (N=320) accounts for inmates who had been placed in the Department's temporary release program, absconded from this program and were then returned to custody. The number of returns in this category was less than 10 percent of the 3,531 recorded in 1994. This is a direct result of Governor Pataki's Executive Order issued in 1995 that restricts the eligible crimes of inmates who participate in the Department's Work Release Program.

Inmates transferred to Central New York Psychiatric Center for mental health services are passed to the legal custody of the Office of Mental Health. These individuals continue to earn time toward the service of their sentence. Inmates who are returned to the Department of Correctional Services from the Office of Mental Health are identified as "Returns from Office of Mental Health" (N=486). "Return from other agency" (N=23) refers to persons who were transferred from the Department to another state, to the federal system, or to other criminal justice agencies and who were subsequently returned to the Department. "Return temporary release arrest" (N=79) refers to inmates who were arrested while out on work release and then returned to Department custody. These inmates did not receive a new sentence prior to their return to DOCS' custody. There were an additional 2 admissions to the Department in 2003 categorized as "other."

Section 2

COMMITMENT OFFENSE


The commitment crime for the persons who were new court commitments to the Department of Correctional Services in 2003 is presented in Table 2.1 and in Figure 2. Commitment crimes are grouped into several larger categories, the first of which is termed "violent felony". During a 1978 special session, the New York State Legislature enacted laws designed to provide for more severe penalties for certain violent felony crimes (see N.Y.S. Penal Law Section 70.02). The Legislature designated certain crimes as "violent felony offenses" (e.g., Attempted Murder 2nd, Manslaughter 1st, Rape 1st, Robbery 1st, Assault 1st). The Legislature did not include Murder 1st, Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the designated violent felony legislation because these crimes are class A-1 felony offenses which already carry the most severe sentences, ranging from 15 years to Life imprisonment or even death. However, due to their violent nature and commensurate sentencing structure, we include Murder 1st, Murder 2nd, Kidnapping 1st and Arson 1st in the violent felony group.

Persons convicted of violent felony crimes were 30% (N=5,125 cases) of 2003 new court commitments.

The second general category is labeled "other coercive" crimes. It includes crimes that are of a violent or coercive nature but were not designated by the legislature as violent felony crimes. These "other coercive" crimes accounted for 10% (N=1,670) of new court commitments. The third category includes all felony classes of drug commitments. Thirty-eight percent (N=6,541) of 2003 new court commitments were for drug offenses. The fourth general category is termed "property offenses" and contains non-violent offenses such as Burglary 3rd, Grand Larceny, Forgery, and Stolen Property. Property offenses comprised 20% of 2003 new court commitments (N=3,405).

The last general category, entitled Youthful Offenders and Juvenile Offenders, were 4% (N=602) of new court commitments. Youthful Offenders (N=560) are persons who were 16 to 19 at the date of the offense for which they were adjudicated to be guilty of a felony crime, and were granted Youthful Offender status by the court, (see New York State Criminal Procedure Law Section 720.10). Juvenile Offenders (N=42) are persons who committed especially serious violent felony offenses before their sixteenth birthday and were tried and convicted as adult offenders, (see NYS CPL 70.05; also see Appendix A, Section 4, of this report for offenses that pertain to Juvenile Offenders and the sentences that apply to them).

Gender Differences in Commitment Crime

The population of persons committed to state prison in 2003 was made up predominately by men offenders (93%). Women offenders were only 7% (N=1,162) of the 17,343 persons committed to state prison in 2003.

Among men committed to state prison in 2003, 30% were convicted of a violent felony crime. This is 1.7 times the percent of women (18%) committed to state prison for violent offenses (see Table 2.1).

Women committed to state prison were, however, more likely to have been convicted of a drug offense than were men. Among women committed to state prison, 47% were convicted of a drug offense compared with 37% of men.

Shifts in Commitment Crime 2000-2003

The number of violent felony offenders committed to state prison increased slightly over the last four years. There were 5,077 violent felony offenders committed in 2000, and 5,125 in 2003. The proportion of new court commitments who were violent felons rose from 27 to 30 percent over the same time period. The proportion of drug offenders in the admission population decreased from 44% in 2000 to 38% in 2003.

Over the same time period, from January 1, 2000 to December 31, 2003, the proportion of violent felons under DOCS' custody rose from 53.3% to 55.8%. (See "Men and Women Undercustody: 1987-2001," DOCS Research, 2003 and "The Hub System: Profile of Inmates Undercustody on January 1, 2004," DOCS Research.)

Section 3

SECOND FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

The New York State Penal Law provides for more severe sentences for second felony offenders and for persistent felony offenders and for sex offenses against a child (see Appendix A). In addition, the penal law requires (with some exceptions) a mandatory state prison term for persons convicted of a second felony offense (see section 70.06 NYS Penal Law).


Among 2003 new court commitments 52% (N=9,002) were sentenced as first felony offenders, 47% as second felony offenders (N=8,173) and 1% (N=168) as persistent felony offenders (see Table 3.1 and Figure 3).

Those persons in Table 3.1 identified as second felony offenders are defendants who were sentenced by the trial court judge as a second felony offender. Some of those persons listed as first felony commitments have been convicted of prior felony crimes and some have previous sentences to state prison, but they were not sentenced as second felony offenders. This most often occurs because the statutes for class A-1 felony crimes do not contain provisions for sentencing as a second felony offender. The penalty for A-1 felony crimes is already the most severe so there is no need for additional enhancement in length of sentence.

There are differences in the percent of persons sentenced as second felony offenders in each general crime group. According to Table 3.1, in 2003, 58% of those committed for drug offenses and 54% of those committed for property offenses were sentenced as second felony offenders. Among those committed for violent felony crimes, 32% were sentenced as second felony offenders.

Table 3.2 also shows crime by second felony offender status, however the percentages are based on felony offender status rather than commitment crime.

Proportion of Second Felony Offenders Decreases

Data are presented in Table 3.3, according to commitment crime, on the number of persons committed to DOCS as a first, second, or persistent felony offender for the period 2000 through 2003. The proportion of commitments sentenced as a second felony offender declined from 51% in 2000 (N=9,457), to 47% (N=8,173) in 2003.

The proportion of violent offenders sentenced as second felony offenders dropped from 34% in 2000 to 32% in 2003. There was also a slight decrease among drug offenders sentenced as second felons from 63% in 2000 to 58% in 2003 (see Table 3.4).

Section 4

FELONY CLASS CATEGORY

In New York State, felony offenses are classified into one of several felony class categories: Class A (including Class A-I and A-II), Class B, Class C, Class D, Class E, and Youthful Offender. In general, more serious offenses are categorized as Class A, Class B, or Class C felonies and the less serious offenses are categorized as Class D or Class E felonies. Youthful Offenders do not have a felony class. There are still less serious offenses that are treated as misdemeanors or violations, but only those convicted of a felony may be sentenced to state prison. Conviction for an "attempt" of a particular felony offense generally drops the conviction into the next lower felony class category. For instance, Robbery 1st is a Class B felony offense, but Attempted Robbery 1st is a Class C felony offense as is Robbery 2nd. The felony class category of the conviction offense is relevant because the sentencing laws are based on the felony class category. That is, the range of minimum and maximum sentences that apply to conviction for a particular offense are governed, in part, by the felony class of the offense.\(^1\) Appendix A contains a brief summary of the range of minimum and maximum sentences for each felony class category.


Table 4.1 shows the specific commitment crime, broken out by felony class category, for new court commitments to DOCS in 2003 (see also Figure 4). (Appendix B contains the Penal Law Section number for the offenses listed in Table 4.1.) The letters "ATT" before the offense indicate that the crime was an attempt. Two percent of 2003 new court commitments were Class A-I crimes (N=316). Class A-II offenses were 4% (N=628) of commitments. Offenses in the Class B felony category were 19% (N=3,255) of 2003 new court commitments. Class C felony offenders were 19% (N=3,337) of 2003 commitments. The Class D felony category was the largest at 35% (N=6,001) of new commitments. Class E felony offenders comprised 19% (N=3,246) of new commitments. Youthful Offenders constituted 3% (N=560) of new commitments.

As stated on page 10 of the report, statutes for class A-1 felony crimes do not contain provisions for sentencing as a second felony offender.

¹For example, the minimum sentence range for a Class D first felony, non-violent offender is 1 year to 2 years and 4 months. The sentencing court judge must select a minimum term that falls between 1 year and 2 years 4 months. Other factors affect the range of sentences that apply to each felony class category. In general, if the offense is a legislatively designated violent felony the sentence length range is more severe. For a Class B first violent felon whose crime of conviction was committed prior to September 1, 1998, the lowest legally permissible minimum term is 3 years. For non-violent Class B first felony offenders, the lowest legally permissible minimum term is one year. Effective September 1, 1998, people convicted of a first violent felony offense receive a determinate sentence. These offenders must, at a minimum, serve 6/7 of a maximum term set by the court. Offenders can earn 1/7 off the fixed term for good behavior. The Legislature had previously extended determinate sentencing to second violent felons effective October 1, 1995. It is also the case that the range of sentences that may be available to the judge after a conviction depends on whether the person is a first, second or persistent felony offender (see Appendix A).

Persons who are convicted as second felony offenders face more severe penalties than do first felony offenders. However, Table 5.2 (page 35) notes that First Felony offenders, as a group, had a higher (46 months) average minimum sentence in 2003 than Second Felony offenders (41 months).

The percent of first, second, and persistent felony offenders in each felony class group is presented in Table 4.2. For many of those sentenced as a second felony offender, it is the existence of a prior felony conviction that results in a state prison commitment. In 1973 the legislature passed laws that required persons convicted of a second felony offense to be sentenced to state prison. As one moves from the Class A-II category to the Class E category the proportion of second felony offenders steadily increases. Two-thirds of Class E (65%) and 56% of Class D commitments were second felony offenders whereas, only 30% of Class B commitments were second felony offenders.

Crime by Felony Class and Predicate Felony Status

In recent years several proposals have been presented to the legislature which would modify sentencing options for the judiciary. Consideration of these proposals has often led to requests for additional information, particularly on the number of court commitments in a calendar year that fall into subgroups defined by: (1) crime, (2) felony crime class and (3) first, second or persistent felony offender status. These data are presented for 2003 in Table 4.3.

Trends in Commitments by Felony Class

Table 4.4 shows changes across the years 2000-2003 in first, second, and persistent offenders and in the crime classes of each offender group. Generally, there were minor changes across the period. Overall, second felony offenders declined from 51% of all offenders in 2000 to 47% in 2003. Class D first felony commitments experienced the largest percentage change of all offenders, increasing from 13% of all commitments in 2000 to 15% of all commitments in 2003.

Section 5

MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM SENTENCE

Persons committed to prison in New York State in 2003 received a sentence based on either (1) the penal law in effect prior to October 1, 1995, (2) the penal laws in effect for violent crimes committed on or after October 1, 1995 (Sentencing Reform Act of 1995), or (3) Jenna's Law, effective September 1, 1998. This section contains a brief summary of the sentencing structure for felons committed to state prison and how this structure was modified by the Sentencing Reform Act of 1995 and Jenna's Law in 1998.


Sentencing Law for Non-Violent Felons, Class A-1 Felons and Old Law Violent Felons

Non-violent felons, class A-1 felons, persistent felony offenders, and second felony, violent felony offenders whose commitment crime occurred before October 1, 1995, as well as first violent felons whose commitment crime preceded September 1, 1998, are committed to state prison with an indeterminate sentence. An indeterminate sentence is composed of a minimum period of imprisonment and a maximum period of imprisonment. The minimum sentence reflects the shortest period of time that a person must serve in prison before being considered for release on parole.2 The maximum sentence reflects the longest possible period that the defendant can be held in custody on the instant offense. Individuals serving an indeterminate sentence are eligible for release to parole after having served the minimum sentence (given favorable action by the Board of Parole) and they must by law be released once the conditional release date is reached (the conditional release date is the point at which twothirds of the maximum sentence has been served).3 Persons in custody may serve past their conditional release dates if they have lost "good time" during service of their sentence either for disciplinary reasons or for failure to satisfactorily participate in designated treatment programs, such as sex offender treatment, aggression replacement therapy or alcohol and substance abuse treatment.4

Felony criminal offenses in New York are classified according to felony categories (Class A-1, A-II, B, C, D, and E felony offenses, and Youthful Offenders). For each felony class category the legislature has enacted certain provisions which affect the length of the minimum term of imprisonment and which determine the range of maximum sentence available to the judge (see Article 70 New York State Penal Law). In addition to the felony class category, the minimum period of imprisonment may differ depending on whether the defendant is a first, second, or persistent felony offender, and, whether or not the defendant has been convicted of a legislatively designated violent felony offense. In general, the minimum-maximum sentence range is more severe for those defendants with a prior felony conviction and for those convicted of violent felony crimes. Appendix A presents a brief summary of the sentences that apply to each felony class category.

³ Since class A felony offenders and Persistent Felony Offenders have life maximum sentences, there are no "conditional release dates" because there are no fixed dates which constitute two-thirds of Life sentences.

Good time refers to days deducted from the maximum sentence for inmates while under custody. Offenders serving indeterminate sentences with less than "life" maximums, may earn up to one-third off of the maximum sentence. Offenders who receive a determinate sentence may earn one-seventh off the determinate sentence for good behavior. These violent offenders can be released after serving six-sevenths of the determinate sentence, provided they have not lost good time.

Second Felons

Under the law prior to October 1, 1995, all second felony offenders were required to serve one-half of their maximum sentences. Under the 1995 Sentencing Reform Act, a second, violent felony offender must receive a determinate sentence. That is, when the crime commission dates are after October 1, 1995, second violent felons receive a maximum term that is fixed by the judge for a specific length of time. For each felony class category there is a range in which the judge may select a fixed sentence. Since the sentence is determinate (i.e., fixed at a specified length), the law eliminates eligibility for early release on parole supervision. This differs from an indeterminate sentence where there is a specified minimum and maximum sentence and the inmate is eligible for release on parole supervision after serving the minimum term. Further, with a determinate sentence the inmate is entitled to earn good time credit up to 1/7 of the determinate term; under the old law (Correction Law Section 803), the inmate was entitled to earn good time credits up to 1/3 of the maximum sentence. The minimum term of imprisonment for a determinate sentence case is computed to be six-sevenths of the determinate sentence.

For non-violent, second felony offenders committed to state prison, the judge must set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-half the maximum sentence. The sentence range for second felony offenders who have committed a violent felony is more severe for offenders where both the instant offense and the prior offense are legislatively designated violent felony crimes than is the case for offenders where the instant offense is a violent felony but the predicate offense was a non-violent felony. These differences are reflected in Appendix A, Sentences to Prison for Second Felony Offense.

First Felons

For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for violent felony crimes committed after October 1, 1995 and prior to September 1, 1998, the judge must in most cases set the minimum period of imprisonment at one-half the maximum sentence. For first violent felons where the date of the crime was prior to October 1, 1995, the minimum term was one-third of the maximum sentence. While the allowable maximum sentence was not changed, for class B first violent felons the minimum sentence range was increased from 2 years to 8 1/3 years under the law prior to October 1995, to a range of 3 years to 12 ½ years under the 1995 Act (see Appendix A, Sentences to Prison for First Felony-Offense). For first felony offenders sentenced to state prison for all offenses that are not designated as a violent felony, the judge must fix the minimum period of imprisonment at some point between one-year and one-third of the maximum term.

Effective September 1, 1998, the New York State Legislature extended determinate sentencing to persons convicted of first violent felony crimes. As with second violent felons convicted after October 1, 1995, first violent felons receive a maximum term fixed by the judge at sentencing. First violent felons are no longer eligible for release by the Board of Parole. They must serve at least 6/7ths of a fixed maximum term. They are eligible to earn good time credit for up to 1/7th of the determinate sentence for good behavior (see Appendix A).

Persistent Felons

For those offenders who have committed three designated violent felony offenses within a statutory period, the 1995 Sentencing Reform Act doubled the minimum period of incarceration. For example, the minimum sentence range for a class B persistent violent felon under the law prior to the 1995 Act was 10-25 years, after the 1995 Sentencing Act the range is 20-25 years (see Appendix A; Sentences to Prison for Persistent Felony Offense).

A crosstabulation of crime by minimum sentence length for 2003 commitments is presented in Table 5.1 (also see Figure 5).

Average and Median Minimum Sentence by Crime

Average and median minimum sentence length according to commitment crime and first or second felony offender status are presented in Table 5.2. In this and other tables the arithmetic average and the median are used as measures of central tendency. The median minimum sentence was 30 months in 2003. The median represents the value of the middle case (i.e., the case or cases at the 50th percentile) in the distribution of cases and is preferred by some users because it is less sensitive to extreme values than is the arithmetic average. Inmates with a sentence of "Life With No Parole" are treated as a minimum term of 45 years (540 months). For death penalty cases, the minimum is treated as missing.

The average minimum sentence for the total new court commitment population in 2003 was 45 months. The average minimum sentence for violent felony crimes was 83 months; for other coercive crimes it was 27 months, for drug offenders 35 months; for property offenders 22 months; and for Youthful/Juvenile Offenders 17 months.

The average minimum sentence was generally longer for persons sentenced as a second or persistent felony offender when compared with those sentenced as a first felony offender. For example, the average minimum sentence for first felons sentenced for Robbery 1st was 67 months, for second felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st it was 104 months, and for persistent felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st the average was 244 months (see Table 5.2). The reader should note, however, that the average minimum sentence for second felony offenders is less than that of first felony offenders. This is because the first felony category includes people sentenced for the class A-1 offenses of Murder 1st, Murder 2nd, Arson 1st and Kidnapping 1st. Since the Class A-1 category has the longest sentence range, there is no enhancement in sentence length that would result from sentencing as a second felony offender. Consequently, persons sentenced for Class A-1 felonies inflate the length of the average minimum sentence for the first felony offender group.

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence Length

The average minimum sentence by crime and second felony offender status for each year 2000 through 2003 is presented in Table 5.3. (This table combines persistent and second felony offenders). The table shows that the overall average minimum sentence increased between 2000 and 2003 for first felons from 44 months to 45 months. Among second felony offenders, the average minimum increased from 45 months in 2000 to 46 months in 2003.

The data in Table 5.3 show that the average minimum sentence for violent felony offenders remained the same from 2000 to 2001 (85 months), decreased to 84 months in 2002, and 83 months in 2003. Average minimum sentence for first violent felony offenders decreased from 82 months in 2000 to 80 months in 2003.

Among second felony offenders convicted of a violent felony, the average minimum sentence decreased from 91 months in 2000 to 84 months in 2002. The average minimum sentence for second felony offenders then rose back up in 2003 to 88 months.

The data in Table 5.3 are repeated in Table 5.4 except that the measure of central tendency is the median.

Minimum Sentence by Felony Class Category

Average minimum sentence by felony class category and second felony offender status for 2003 New Court Commitments is presented in Table 5.5. These figures show that as the felony class declines from A to E the average minimum sentence declines. Generally, within each felony class category, as one moves from first felony offender to second felony offender to persistent felony offender, the average minimum sentence increases, as would be expected based on the sentencing requirements found in the New York State Penal Law (see Appendix A for a brief statement of the sentence range for each subgroup).

Table 5.6 shows the average and median minimum sentence by felony class category and by first or second felony offender status. In general, the average minimum for class D and E first felony offenders has remained steady over the period 2000 to 2003, while in comparison, the average minimum for class B and C first felony offenders has increased over the period 2000 to 2003.

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence by Violent and Second Felony Offender Status

In Table 5.7 where the data are broken out by felony class category, violent or nonviolent offense, and first or second felony offender status, several categories of offenders show increases in the average minimum sentence between 2000 to 2003.

Among first violent felony offenders convicted of Class B, C, or E felonies, the average minimum sentence increased between 2000 and 2003. For example, among Class B first violent offenders, the average minimum was 96 months in 2000 but increased to 103 months in 2003. Among non-violent, first felons there was only a slight increase in average minimum sentence for Class B and Class C felons. For example, Class B non-violent, first felons received average minimum sentences of 24 months in 2000 and 26 months in 2003, and Class C non-violent felons received average minimum sentences of 23 months in 2000 and 26 months in 2003.

Among second violent felony offenders convicted of D felonies, the average minimum sentence increased between 2000 and 2003. For Class D second violent offenders, the average minimum was 52 months in 2002, but increased to 60 months in 2003. For Class C and E second violent felony offenders, the increase from 2000 to 2003, respectively, for average minimum sentence was slighter, a three month increase for Class C and a two month increase for Class E.

Among second non-violent felony offenders, increases for average minimum sentence from 2000 to 2003 were slight. For Class B, Class C, and Class D second non-violent offenders, the increase from 2000 to 2003, respectively, for average minimum sentence was a one month increase for Class B, a two month increase for Class C, and a two month increase for Class D. For Class E second non-violent offenders, the increase (0.1 months) was negligible.

A cross tabulation of commitment crime by maximum sentence is presented in Table 5.8A.

Persons committed for violent felony offenses were more likely (30%) to be given a maximum sentence of eight years (96 months) or longer when compared with drug (29%) or property offenders (4%). Eight percent of violent felony offenders received a Life maximum sentence (see Table 5.8A). Ten percent of drug offenders received a Life maximum sentence.

Table 5.9 shows average and median maximum sentence length by crime and second felony offender status. A Life sentence has been treated as 25 years. For commitments with a sentence of "Life With No Parole" the maximum sentence is treated as 45 years (540 months). For death penalty cases the maximum is treated as missing in tables where average and median maximum sentence length are presented.

For 2003 new court commitments the average maximum sentence was 80 months, the median 48 months. The average maximum sentence for a first felony offender was 85 months, the median 48 months. The average maximum sentence for a second felony offender was 71 months, and the median was 60 months.

Trends in Average Maximum Sentence Length

The average maximum sentence by crime and second felony status for each year 2000 through 2003 is presented in Table 5.10. (This table combines persistent and second felony offenders.) This table shows that with the exception of 2001, when the average maximum sentence for first felony offenders was 83 months, first felony offenders received an average maximum sentence of approximately 86 months between 2000 and 2003. Among second felony offenders, the average maximum remained around 74 months between 2000 and 2002, then slightly increased to 75 months during 2003.

The data in Table 5.10 show that the average maximum sentence for violent felony offenders decreased between 2000 and 2003 from 101 months in 2000 to 95 months in 2003. A similar pattern was observed for first violent felony offenders whose average maximum sentence decreased from 97 months in 2000 to 90 months in 2003.

The average maximum sentence for second violent felony offenders decreased between 2000 and 2002, from 109 months in 2000 to 102 months in 2002. The average maximum sentence for second violent felony offenders then rose to 105 months in 2003.

Section 6

PRIOR ADULT CRIMINAL RECORD

Prior adult criminal record for 2003 new court commitments is presented in Table 6.1. Persons are coded according to their most serious contact with the criminal justice system.

The first category shows those who have no prior felony or misdemeanor arrests. The second category contains those persons who have prior arrests but no prior convictions (i.e., charges were dismissed or defendant was acquitted, or the rap sheet has no further information on disposition of the charges). The third category consists of those who have prior convictions but did not receive a sentence to jail (i.e., they were sentenced to probation, fined, adjourned in contemplation of dismissal, ordered to pay restitution, or other sentencing alternative). The fourth category includes those who have prior convictions and who received a sentence that included a term in a local jail (including those who may have received a sentence of jail and then probation). The last category includes those persons who have served a prior state or federal prison term.

Among 2003 commitments, 30% had served a prior prison term for a felony conviction. An additional 28% had served a prior term in a local jail that could have been as a result of either a felony or misdemeanor conviction. Another 21% had a prior felony or misdemeanor conviction which resulted in a sentence to probation or a fine or other non-incarcerative sentencing alternative. Seven percent had prior misdemeanor or felony arrests, but these arrests did not result in a conviction. Thirteen percent had no prior arrests (see Figure 6).

The data presented in Table 6.1 also show that 79% of the 2003 new court commitments had prior convictions for misdemeanor or felony offenses. Property offenders were the most likely to have prior convictions (91%), followed by drug offenders (83%), other coercive offenders (81%), and violent felony offenders (70%). Youthful offenders and juvenile offenders were the least likely to have prior convictions (46% and 31%, respectively).

Trends in Prior Adult Criminal Record

Prior criminal history for new court commitments during the years 2000 to 2003 is shown in Table 6.2. The percent of commitments by prior criminal record categories is largely unchanged over the four-year period. The proportion of new commitments with prior incarceration, either jail or prison, decreased about three percent in the interval (61% to 58%).

Section 7

DRUG COMMITMENTS


The number of drug offenders committed to state prison decreased by 20 percent between 2000 (N=8,227) and 2003 (N=6,541) (see Table 7.1), a decline that occurred in all felony class categories.

The proportion of drug commitments who were sentenced as second felony offenders steadily decreased between 2000 and 2003. Specifically, 63% of 2000 drug commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders, compared with 61% in 2001, 60% in 2002 and 58% in 2003.

The data presented in Table 7.3 indicate that as felony class decreases from Class A-II felonies to Class E felonies, the proportion of second felony offenders increases. For example, in 2003, 15% of Class A-II felony drug offenders were sentenced as second felony offenders, while 35% of Class B, 67% of Class C, 79% of Class D, and 89% of Class E drug felony commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders. This pattern maintains across the 2000-2003 time period.

All Class A-1 drug offenders are sentenced as first felony offenders. Since the A-1 category already carries the most severe sentence (at least 15 years to life) there is no need to provide enhanced penalties for second offenders who commit a Class A-1 drug felony. Even though they are sentenced as first felony offenders, Class A-1 offenders may have prior felony convictions. Of the 33 Class A-1 drug offenders received in 2003, 52% (17) have prior felony convictions.

Trends in Drug Commitments by Possession or Sale

Of those committed to state prison for a drug offense, the majority are commitments for drug sale, outnumbering those for drug possession by 3 to 2 (see Table 7.4 and Figure 7).

However, since 2000 the percent of drug commitments to state prison who were convicted of drug sale decreased from 72% of total drug commitments in 2000 (N=5,915) to 60% of drug commitments in 2003 (N=3,912).

Trends in Drug Commitments by Region

Drug commitments to state prison from New York City decreased by 29%, from 5,877 in 2000, to 4,149 in 2003. (See Table 7.5, counties that fall into each specific region are listed in Table 11.1). Over the period 2000 to 2003, the majority of Upstate drug commitments were sentenced as first felony offenders, whereas the majority of Downstate drug commitments were sentenced as second felony offenders.

Table 7.6 shows felony crime class and second felony offender status for drug commitments over the period 2000 to 2003. In this table the five New York City counties are shown separately.

Drug Commitments by Gender

Male drug offenders, in 2003, were more likely to be sentenced as Second Felony offenders (59%) than female drug offenders (49%) (see Table 7.7).

Drug Commitments by Race/Ethnic Status

The majority of Whites committed for drug offenses were first felony commitments (62%) in 2003 (see Table 7.8). This is different from the pattern for African American and Hispanic offenders where the majority of drug offenders were second felony offenders (65% and 53%, respectively) (see Table 7.8).

Trends in Average Minimum Sentence for Drug Offenders

As the felony class category of drug commitments declined from most serious (i.e., Class A-I, Class A-II) to least serious (Class E) the average minimum sentence also declined (see Table 7.9). Further, second felony offenders received longer sentences than first felony offenders (see Table 7.10). For example, in 2003 a first felony offender convicted of a Class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 24 months, but a second felony offender convicted of a Class B drug felony received a minimum term (on average) of 62 months. Examining the median minimum sentence provides a similar picture. In 2003, a Class B felon convicted as a first felony offender received a median minimum sentence of 24 months, four months longer than a year earlier, while a Class B second felony offender received a median minimum of 54 months, unchanged since 2000 (see Table 7.10).

The average minimum sentence for the total group of drug offenders committed in 2003 was 35 months. This figure has remained fairly constant throughout the study period of 2000-2003. For first felony offenders, the average minimum sentence was 31 months and for second felony offenders, the average minimum sentence was 37 months in 2003. The difference in average minimum sentences between the two groups is not greater due to the larger number of Class D and E offenders in the second felony group (offenders with comparatively lower minimum sentences) and the higher concentration of Class A-I and A-II offenders in the first felony group (who have comparatively longer sentences).


There were significant differences in the type of commitment offenses of men and women. In 2003, 30% of men were committed for a violent felony offense compared with only 18% of women (see Table 8.1). Men were also slightly more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (10% compared with 7% for women). Women were more likely than men to be committed for property and other offenses (25% and 19%, respectively). On the other hand, women were considerably more likely than men to be committed to state prison for a drug offense (47% compared with 37% for men). While men and women were equally likely to be convicted of drug possession (15% and 17%, respectively), women were much more likely to be convicted of drug sale (31% for women and 22% for men).

The proportion of women committed to state prison for a drug offense declined from 59% in 2000 to 47% in 2003. Among men the percentage similarly declined from 43% in 1999 to 37% in 2003.

Long Term Trend

Table 8.2 provides a historical view of the gender distribution of new commitments. The largest number of women offenders committed to state prison were admitted in calendar year 1991 (N=2,264). In 2003 there were 1,162 women new commitments. From 1980 to 1985 women were approximately 4% of the annual pool of court commitments. Then following a transition period from 1986 to 1988, the proportion of women in the annual pool jumped in 1989 to a new plateau of approximately 8%. The proportion of women in the new commitments cohort spiked to a high of 9.4% in 1991 before gradually descending to 6.7% in 2003. The 1,162 female admissions in 2003 represent the fewest female admissions since 1988. However, the number is almost triple the 405 female admissions received a generation earlier in 1981.

RACE/ETHNIC STATUS

In 2003, 20% of commitments were White, 47% were African American, and 30% were Hispanic. The balance, including "not stated" contributed 3% of the total commitments (N=452) (see Table 9.1).


Commitment offense by ethnic status for 2003 new court commitments is shown in Tables 9.2 and 9.3. A lower proportion of Whites (26%) than African Americans (32%) were committed for violent felony offenses (see Table 9.2). In these tables Native American, Asian and other ethnic groups are categorized as "other." The proportion of Hispanics (29%) committed for violent offenses was greater than the proportion of Whites and less than the proportion of African Americans committed for violent offenses. Whites were more likely to be committed for other coercive offenses (14%) than either African Americans (9%) or Hispanics (7%).

There are important differences in commitments to prison for drug offenses according to race/ethnic statistics.

In brief, during 2003, White offenders were primarily committed to state prison for property offenses (42%) and violent felony offenses (26%). African American offenders were primarily committed for drug offenses (42%) and secondarily for violent felony offenses (32%). Hispanic offenders committed to state prison in 2003 were primarily drug offenders (49%) and 29% were violent felony offenders (see Table 9.2).

Table 9.3 shows the ethnic status distribution for specific offenses with the percentages based on each offense group. For example, among commitments for murder in 2003 (N=253), 15% were Whites (N=39), 59% were African Americans (N=150), 24% were Hispanics (N=60), and the remaining 2% (N=4) were "others."

Race/Ethnic Status of Women Commitments

Earlier tables have shown the high percentage of drug offenses among women. The data in Table 9.4 show that 59% of Hispanic women and 53% of African American women committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. In sharp contrast, only 26% of White women committed to state prison were sentenced for a drug offense. White women were considerably more likely to be committed for a property offense (47%) than were African-American women (18%) or Hispanic women (15%) (see Table 9.4).

Trends in Commitment Crime by Ethnic Status

The number of White, African American and Hispanic offenders in each crime category for commitment years 2000 through 2003 is shown in Table 9.5. These are the figures upon which the percentages in Table 9.6 are based.

The proportion of African Americans committed for violent felony offenses slightly increased from 29% in 2000 to 32% in 2003 (see Table 9.6). In other areas there were also either minor changes or no changes in African American offense patterns in the period 2000-2003.

There was a decline among Whites in the percent committed for violent felony crimes between 2000 (28%) and 2003 (26%) (see Table 9.6). There was also a slight decrease in the percent of Whites committed for drug offenses between 2000 (15%) and 2003 (14%).

Among Hispanics the proportion committed for violent crimes rose from 25% in 2000 to 29% in 2003. There was a decrease in Hispanic drug offense commitments from 58% in 2000 to 49% in 2003.

The number of males in each crime and ethnic status group for the years 2000 to 2003 is presented in Table 9.7. The percent figures in Table 9.8 are based on the numbers in Table 9.7. Since males are such a predominant portion of total commitments, the patterns in the ethnic status distribution of offenses are similar to those found in Table 9.6.

Trends in Commitment Crime by Race/Ethnic Status for Females

As stated previously, the number of women committed to state prison dropped during the period 2000–2003. This decline occurred across all the ethnic categories except White females who increased from 269 in 2000 to 292 in 2003 (see Table 9.9). The largest percentage change was the 25% decrease in the number of African American women committed to state prison from 692 in 2000 to 520 in 2003.

The crime distribution of White women new court commitments was relatively stable in the violent felony offense category. Decreases were observed in the coercive offense category (10% in 2000 to 7% in 2003), and in the drug offense category (27% in 2000 to 26% in 2003). However, an increase was observed in the property and other offense category (42% in 2000 to 47% in 2003).

The crime distribution of African American women slightly increased in the violent felony offense category (17% in 2000 to 19% in 2003, after decreasing to 16% in 2002), and increased in the coercive offense category (5% in 2000 to 8% in 2003). However, the distribution of African American women decreased in the drug category (from 62% in 2000 to 53% in 2003) and increased for property and other offenses (from 15% in 2000 to 18% in 2003).

Hispanic women increased in the coercive offense category (3% in 2000 to 6% in 2003), but decreased in the drug offense category (from 78% in 2000 to 59% in 2003), while increasing in the violent felony offense category (from 11% in 2000 to 18% in 2003), and property and other offense categories (from 7% in 2000 to 15% in 2003).

AGE AT ADMISSION

The average age at admission was 31.6 years in 2003 (see Table 10.1). On average, women were older than men at the time of admission. For men the average age was 31.4 years while for women it was 34.6 years (see Table 10.1).

Across the three major race/ethnic groupings, Whites were the oldest at commitment (average age 33.5 years), followed by Hispanics (average age 31.6 years). African-Americans (30.8 years) were the youngest. Others (Asians, Native American, etc.) were also 30.8 years (see Table 10.2).


The age distribution by gender and ethnic status for 2003 new court commitments is presented in Table 10.3A and 10.3B.

Crime by age at commitment (broken into 13 age categories) is presented in Table 10.4. Drug and property crime commitments were somewhat older than violent felony commitments. For example, only 39.4% of violent felony 2003 new commitments were at least 30 years of age or older at commitment, compared to 52% of drug offenders and 68% of property offenders.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Gender

Among 2003 commitments, women were at least two years older on average than were men committed for the same category of offenses, except among property and other offenders and Youthful Offenders/Juvenile Offenders, where the age gap was a year or less (see Table 10.5).

It can also be seen in Table 10.5 that for men and women, the average age at commitment within the violent felony group was relatively stable between 2000 and 2003. However, women's violent felony group average age briefly decreased from 31.1 years old in 2000 to 29.3 years in 2001. The average age of both men and women was relatively stable from 2000 to 2003 in the crime categories of drug offenders, property and older offenders, and Youthful Offenders/Juvenile Offenders. However, the average of both men and women increased from 31.6 years in 2000 to 32.4 years in 2001, decreased back to 31.8 years in 2002 and remained at 31.8 years in 2003.

Average Age at Admission by Crime and Race/Ethnic Status

Whites committed in 2003 for violent felony crimes were older (average age 33.4 years) than either African-Americans (average age 28.5 years) or Hispanics (average age 28.9 years) committed for violent crimes (see Table 10.6). Whites committed in 2003 for other coercive crimes were also older (average age 33.0 years) than African-Americans (average age 31.9 years) or Hispanics (average age 30.6 years). However, among drug offenders, average ages were equivalent for Whites (33.1 years), Hispanics (33.6 years), while African-Americans (31.3 years) were two years younger.

Trends in Age at Commitment

Offenders committed in 2003 were the same age (average age 31.6 years) as those committed in 2000 (average age 31.6 years) (see Table 10.7). Between 2000 and 2003, the percent of commitments that were 25 to 34 years of age declined from 32% to 31%, while commitments that were 40 and older increased from 20% to 21%.

COUNTY AND REGION OF COMMITMENT

Fifty-four percent (N=9,373) of 2003 new court commitments were sentenced to state prison from New York City (see Table 11.1 and Figure 11). The 62 counties in New York State are grouped for statistical purposes into 4 larger regions. New York City refers to commitments from Kings, New York, Queens, Richmond, and Bronx counties, the five counties (or boroughs) that comprise New York City. Suburban New York City refers to Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester counties. The Upstate Urban region refers to counties in Upstate New York that have a population center of 50,000 or more. Finally, Upstate Other refers to all the remaining New York State counties.


Eleven percent (N=1,985) were sentenced from the Suburban counties near New York City. Eighteen percent (N=3,171) were committed from Upstate Urban counties and 16% (N=2,813) from Upstate Other counties. Table 11.1 also shows that a somewhat lower proportion of women (50%) were from New York City than were men (54%).

Commitment Crime by County and Region

There were important differences in commitment crime according to region of the state. Commitments from New York City were most likely to be drug offenders (44%) followed by violent felony offenders (31%) and then property offenders (14%) (See Table 11.2). The Suburban New York counties were similar to New York City with drug commitments as the largest category (34%), followed by violent felony offenders (33%) and then property offenders (20%). Compared with either New York City or Suburban New York City, persons committed from Upstate counties were less likely to be committed for drug offenses. Thirty-one percent of Upstate Urban commitments were for violent felony offenses with an additional 31% for drug offenses. Among Upstate Other counties, drug offenses (26%) and property offenses (35%) accounted for most of the total new commitments.

Table 11.3 presents the commitment crime distribution for each New York State county.

Felony Class of Crime by Region

The percent of cases in each felony class category was similar across regions of the state (see Table 11.4) with a few exceptions. For example, among commitments from New York City there was a higher percentage of Class B felony offenders (23%) and a somewhat lower percent of Class E felony offenders (15%) when compared with other regions. The Suburban New York region had a higher percentage of Class D felony offenders (39%). The Upstate Urban region had a somewhat lower percent of Class B (12%) commitments and a somewhat higher percent of class D commitments (39%) than other regions. The Upstate Other region had a higher percent of Class E felons (28%) than do other regions.

Trends in Commitments by Region

There was some change in the percentage of offenders committed from each region of the state from 2000 to 2003 (see Table 11.5). New York City's contribution to the new commitment population dropped five percent from 59% in 2000 to 54% in 2003. In 2000, the Downstate area (New York City and Suburban New York) accounted for 69% of all new commitments, but this area reported 65% of new commitments in 2003.

In 2000, the Upstate area (Upstate Urban and Upstate Other) accounted for 31% of all new commitments, but this area reported 34% of all new commitments in 2003. The Upstate Urban area's contribution to the new commitment population increased three percent, from 15% in 2000 to 18% in 2003. The Upstate Other area's contribution to the new commitment population remained at 16% between 2000 and 2003.

Accordingly, while the Downstate area's contribution to the new commitment population dropped four percent between 2000 and 2003, the Upstate area's contribution to the new commitment population increased three percent between 2000 and 2003.

COUNTRY OF BIRTH

Table 12.1 presents crime by birthplace for 2003 new court commitments. In this table, countries are grouped into world regions.

For 2003 new court commitments, 87% or 15,146 are native born (United States and U.S. possessions), while 13% or 2,176 are foreign-born.

Violent felonies comprised 29% (or 4,356) of the 15,146 native born offenders, while violent felonies comprised 35% (or 761) of the 2,176 foreign-born offenders.

Drug felonies comprised 37% (or 5,557) of the 15,146 native born offenders, while drug felonies comprised 45% (or 975) of the 2,176 foreign-born offenders.

Although 30% of the total new commitments were for violent felonies, the world regions did not contribute in equal proportions to this category. For example, 59% of new commitments from Central America and 68% of new commitments from North America were violent felons.

A high percentage of the offenders born in U.S. Possessions (55%), island nations in the Caribbean (58%), and South America (47%) were sentenced for drug offenses.

Of the 6,532 drug offenders committed in 2003 with data on country of birth, 76% (N=4,938) were born in the United States, 10% (N=619) in U.S. Possessions, and 14% (N=975) in foreign nations (see Table 12.1).



EDUCATION

Education level by gender for 2003 new court commitments is presented in Table 13.1. In this table, education status refers to the last school grade completed as reported by the inmate. On average, inmates reported 10.6 years of schooling (see Table 13.1).

In order to properly place inmates in education programs, the Department administers a battery of tests during the reception/classification process. These include tests on reading vocabulary and reading comprehension given in English or Spanish or both. In those cases where inmates were tested in English and Spanish, the results are combined with the inmate scores reflecting the score received on the Spanish language, test if higher. In Table 13.2, which shows the distribution of combined reading vocabulary and reading comprehension scores for 2003 new commitments, the average reading level (6.9) was found to be about equal to 7th grade. Thus, while the average grade completed as reported at reception was more than 10th grade, the more sensitive measure of tested reading proficiency was 3 grade levels below this. While only two percent of inmates claimed education year completed of 4th grade or below (see Table 13.1), slightly more than one-fourth (28%) performed on reading tests at less than the 5th grade level (see Table 13.2).

Results from tests on ability to perform math computations and to solve math problems are shown in Table 13.3. For 2003 new commitments, the average proficiency in mathematics based on these test scores (6.2) was at the 6th grade level.

Beginning with Calendar Year 2003, each type of test score (reading and mathematics) consists of combining English and Spanish, with the utilization of the higher numerical test score. If neither an English nor Spanish test score for 2003 is present, the most recent prior year in which there was a test score present is utilized.

Trends in Education Level

Reading proficiency based on tests administered at reception was at the 7th grade level (6.6) in 2000 (see Table 13.4). It remained at 7th grade level for 2001-2003. Average proficiency level in math remained stable at the 6th grade level for 2000-2003.



Section 14

MARITAL STATUS

Among 2003 new commitments, 70% were single, never married; 16% of commitments were legally married; a further 4% reported common law relationships; and 10% indicate that they were divorced, widowed or separated (see Table 14.1). Women (16%) were more likely than men (10%) to report they were divorced, separated or widowed. Men (4%) were more likely than women (0.8%) to report a common law relationship.

The proportion of legally married new commitments was largely unchanged between 2000 and 2003 at between 15% and 16%.



Section 15

JAIL TIME

Individuals committed to state prison frequently accumulate time in local jail prior to the date of reception at a New York State correctional facility. Following arrest, the court may require that a defendant post bail to ensure that the defendant will re-appear at a later date for further court proceedings. Those unable to post bail when it is required by the court will generally be confined in a local jail pending court proceedings. For those individuals facing the most serious charges or considered to be a risk to society, bail may be denied outright prior to conviction. Jail time may also accumulate between the date of sentencing and the date of transfer to a state correctional facility. Time spent in a local jail prior to commitment to state prison is credited toward service of the minimum term.

The average length of time 2003 new court commitments served in jail (6.7 months) remained the same as the level of 2002 (6.7 months). (See Table 15.1, Median Time Served is presented in Table 15.2).

Jail Time by Crime and Crime Class

Violent felony offenders served more jail time than other offenders. In 2003, new commitments convicted of a violent felony had served 9.0 months on average compared to 6.3 months for other coercive offenders, 6.0 months for drug offenders and 5.2 months for property offenders (see Table 15.1). Also, the table shows that when sentenced for the same crime, second felony offenders usually have served more jail time than those sentenced as first felony offenders. For instance, second felony offenders committed for Robbery 1st in 2003 served 10.2 months of jail time on average compared with 9.2 months for first felony offenders convicted of Robbery 1st. The reason that the discrepancy between the average jail time for the total group of first felony offenders (6.6 months) and second felony offenders (6.8 months) is not wider is a high concentration of drug and property offenders in the second felony group (see Section 4, p. 18-28).

Average and median jail time by felony class category, 1st or 2nd felony offender status, and violent or non-violent offender status is presented in Table 15.3. For first violent felons and second felony offenders, as felony crime class declines from Class A-1 to Class E, the average jail time declines.

Jail Time by Region

In 2000, the average jail time for commitments from New York City was 7.6 months and in 2003 it was 7.5 months (see Table 15.4). For Suburban New York counties, the average jail time in 2003 (7.9 months) was about 0.5 months greater than it was in 2000 (7.4 months). For Upstate Urban counties, the average jail time was 5.3 months in 2000, and was 5.1 months in 2003. For Upstate Other counties, the average jail time was 6.9 months in 2000, and dropped to 6.7 months in 2003.

LIFE WITHOUT PAROLE

In 2003, there were 15 new commitments to the Department with sentences of Life Without Parole. The highest total for a year was 25 in 1999. There were no women sentenced to Life Without Parole in 2003. These 15 Lifers committed in 2003 ranged in age from 22 years to 46 years old at commitment. Six were committed from New York City, two from Suburban New York, and seven came from Upstate New York (see Table 16.1).

For offenders in this category, both the instant offense and the prior offense are violent felony crimes. Where the instant offense is a violent felony crime and the prior offense is <u>not</u> a violent crime, the sentence ranges used by the court (for class B through E) would be those listed under "All Other Felony Offenses."

Since the sentence is determinate (i.e. fixed at a specified length), the law eliminates eligibility for release on parole supervision. This differs from an indeterminate sentence where there is a specified minimum and maximum sentence and the inmate is eligible for release on parole supervision after serving the minimum term. Further, with a determinate sentence the inmate is entitled to earn good time credit up to 1/7 of the determinate term, under the prior law (Correction Law Section 803), the inmate was entitled to earn good time credits up to 1/3 of the maximum sentence.

Under Penal Law 70.07 ("Sentence of Imprisonment for Second Child Sexual Assault Felony Offender"), there are various enhanced sentences for such child sexual assault felonies, where the victim is a child less than fifteen years old. Certain sentences must be indeterminate, whereas certain other sentences must be determinate (see chart below for specification of such enhanced sentences).
